
## A gift for every child in our parish.

# The Stukeleys Parish Council News

The Parish Council Meeting was held on the 7th March at Little Stukeley Village Hall.

Due to the current extremely low values of scrap materials, the Parish Council will not receive any rebates from WEEE recycling collections of electrical waste at the present time. However, as the collections provide a service to the village community and benefits the environment the Parish Council have asked WEEE to arrange another collection event in May/June .....so please look out for posters advertising the collection date.

The Parish Council continues to report to CCC Highways highway faults and repairs in the village, but please remember parishioners can report faults directly by calling **0845 0455212 or via www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/highwayfaults**

The following planning applications were considered by the Parish Council:

- i 26 Ermine Street, Little Stukeley 16/00117/HHFUL Demolish single storey side extension and form side two storey extension.
  - After discussion it was agreed to make no observations for or against.
- ii 24 Low Road, Little Stukeley 16/00125/HHFUL Construction of new garage structure with alterations to driveway.
  - After discussion the Parish Council agreed to recommend refusal as the planned development would have an adverse effect on the street scene. The Stukeleys Parish Council recommended that the planned garage be moved back away from the front boundary.
- iii 24 Low Road, Little Stukeley 16/00124/HHFUL Two storey extension to existing dwelling including living area, downstairs WC, store room, bedroom and ensuite.
  After discussion the Parish Council agreed to recommend approval as the extension would
- iv Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street 16/00262/NMA Application for non-material amendment to approval of reserved matters (outside of a key phase) for primary infrastructure to support the delivery of the primary school (KP1-01)
  - After discussion the Parish Council agreed to make no observations for or against.
- v 17 Beech Avenue, Great Stukeley 16/00250/TREE Beech tree: crown lift the tree to 5 metres. After discussion the Parish Council agreed to recommend approval.
- vi 8 Beech Avenue, Great Stukeley 16/00251/TREE Large mature beech; low branches infringe on the road and driveway, and low lateral branches now infringe on the front of the house, blocking light from the front windows. Proposed work is to crown lift the tree to 4 metres to improve access beneath, and to reduce lateral branches close to the house by approx. 3 metres, up to a height of approx. 6 metres.
  - After discussion the Parish Council agreed to recommend approval.
- vii 18 Chestnut Grove, Great Stukeley 16/00268/TREE Fell a Horse Chestnut due to ill health. Crown lift and reduce end weight of a Horse Chestnut T2. T3 Beech tree: removal of the central stem.
  - After discussion the Parish Council agreed to recommend approval.

viii 67 Ermine Street, Great Stukeley – 16/00254/HHFUL – New access to side of house to enable future occupants access to rear part of garden to be used as paddock land..

After discussion the Parish Council agreedto recommend refusal as the proposed new access would be lead onto an already busy road and result in road safety issues. The access was unnecessary as there was an adequate access to the paddock between the eastern boundary of the property and the garage.

#### HAVE YOUR SAY

All Parish Councillors should be present at **Open Surgeries** which start at **7:15pm to 7:30pm** (prior to Parish Council Meetings) where parishioners are invited to attend to **express their support, views or concerns on issues affecting the Parish**. As the Open Surgery only runs from 7:15pm to 7:30pm, if a parishioners wished to discuss items in more detail please contact a Parish Councillor and a further meeting can be arranged.

The Parish Council Meeting then should start promptly at 7:30pm, only items on the agenda can be discussed and raised during the public participation session, and each speaker is limited to 3 minutes speaking time unless directed by the Chairman of the meeting. Parishioners are encouraged to write to Parish Council/Parish Clerk on issues if they wish to give more details than the 3 minute slot allows.

If wish to speak at an Open Surgery Session and/or the Public Participation Session please let the Chairman of the meeting or Parish Clerk know at the meeting.

#### **Anglian Water – Pollution Watch**

Anglian Water are planning to launch a new campaign called "Pollution Watch". It is all about ensuring we **Spot**, **Report** and **Stop** sewage pollution incidents as quickly as possible and minimise the impact to the environment.

A key part of our business is to return used water from homes and businesses safely back into the environment. This is no small operation and requires a huge number of assets, including over 76,000km of sewer pipes - that's enough to go around the world twice! We work hard to ensure that these operate effectively at all times. However, very occasionally sewage escapes from the system causing a pollution incident. Pollution can kill fish and other aquatic life and also affect the use of water and land for agricultural, business, community purposes.

Escapes from the sewage system are commonly caused by the build-up of fats, oils and greases, sanitary waste and wipes; all of which cause blockages and reduce the flow of sewage through the network.

There are many tell-tale signs that pollution has entered a river or a stream. These include:

sewage solids toilet debris such as toilet paper, condoms and sanitary products soap suds or a milky-looking discharge in the water

grey coloured water

a noticeable sewage smell

Our Love Every Drop strategy, which puts water at the heart of a whole new way of living, includes a business goal of No Pollutions. We're investing millions in pollution prevention through continually maintaining and improving our asset base and enhancing our understanding of its performance. This includes £5.5 million of network maintenance; analysis to predict potential sewer blockages; enhanced maintenance at pumping stations; increasing the number of staff on pollution control and working with river-users to help us identify and report problems quickly.

We are working hard to minimise pollution incidents from our assets, and we'd really like your help to look after rivers and waterways too. By calling our Pollution Hotline on **03457 145 145** and informing us about potential sewage pollution issues, we can respond sooner meaning we have the best opportunity to minimise any environmental impact.

To support this, we plan to launch the "**Pollution Watch**" campaign to raise awareness of sewage pollution, the causes of it, and what to do if you spot it. We aim to work at parish level with local communities to help understand the sewerage network and its performance and what to do if you spot a problem.

To launch the campaign, we are running a project across our region to work together on the following areas:

to explore the general level of understanding of the sewerage network and its function within your area

to identify the likely locations of discharges from the network within your area

to discuss the wording for signs at these locations

to consider ways of working together to spread the word

We aim to have a programme of activity over the next 5 years to work with more and more parish councils across our region.

#### Huntingdonshire Beekeepers (HBKA) - Honey Bee Swarm Collection Contacts 2016

You may be aware that each year HBKA volunteers make themselves available to advise our local communities should a honey bee swarm be found. We try as far as possible to capture and remove the swarms to a new 'home' so that they are not lost to our environment. Sometimes this is not possible but we do our best to at least advise the land or building owner on the best way forward.

This year there is a list that shows beekeepers in your locality who are willing to pick up swarms when that is possible subject to an assessment of the risks involved to all concerned. We collect at no cost but a donation to our association funds is always welcomed.

It should be noted that we can only collect honey bees. Wasps, hornets and bumble bees are all outside our levels of ability and competence and need referring to pest controllers.

As an aside and a little bit of PR! I hope you might take time during the summer and visit our Apiary and its viewing gallery in Hinchingbrooke Country Park. We open the hives on Sunday afternoons from April to September weather permitting from 2 -3pm so you can see inside from the bee free safety of the gallery.

With your help we have now sufficient funds to develop further our website and John and Nichola Oldfield and I are in touch with a consultant to help us with this task.






