Following the article in the February edition, I wanted to update and invite readers to meetings to support the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan.

There are many developments within the emerging HDC Local Plan that will affect the Parish out to 2036 and beyond – including Alconbury Weald, Grange Farm, housing to both east and west of Ermine Street, re-alignment of the A141 and the Country Park.

You are invited to the Public Meeting to be held to communicate and organise the Parish Forum to support the development of the Neighbourhood Plan.

The Public Meeting will cover:

- 1. A summary of the major developments in and around the Parish, with initial responses invited and noted.
- 2. Explanation of the process for making the Neighbourhood Plan.
- 3. Invitation to the Groups needed to supporting making the Neighbourhood Plan.

We will be establishing two groups to give the widest opportunity for Parishioners to get involved in making the Neighbourhood Plan:

- 1. Neighbourhood Plan Forum Team which will focus on preparing the plan including research, analysis and preparation of reports.
- 2. Neighbourhood Plan Consultation Group whose members will meet to review progress with the Forum Team to provide the widest range of perspectives to allow the Plan to reflect the different interests across the Parish.

The meeting will be held at the Alconbury Weald Club (Room 4) on Saturday 13th April 2-4pm and repeated on Monday 15th April 7-9pm.

I look forward to meeting you at whichever time is best for you. Please contact me in advance, or Michael Monk or any of the Parish Councillors if you have any questions.

NEW: ROYAL BOTANTICAL GARDENS, KEW Tuesday 21st May 2019

With its seemingly endless glass panes and 10,000 exotic plants *The Temperate House* is a botanists' paradise and the place that Sir David Attenborough escaped to when life was "getting him down".

On Saturday 5th May 2018 after a five year (2013-2018) restoration costing £41 million the refurbished *Temperate House* was opened at *Kew Gardens*. The Grade 1 listed building is the worlds' biggest Victorian glasshouse. The restoration saw the ironwork stripped back and touched up with 5,280 liters of paint and 15,000 panes of glass were removed and replaced by a workforce of more than 400. The *Temperate House* is the length of a Boeing 747 and 110 miles of scaffolding were used in the renovation, equivalent to the length of the M25. The *Temperate House* has now been restored to its former glory and is a glistening cathedral where the new glass allows the sun to stream in. The *Temperate House* is home to some of the rarest and most threatened plants in the world. Some 1,500 species are on display and three plant species , which are extinct in the wild , are housed here.

This day trip on Tuesday 21st May 2019 offers the terrific opportunity to see one of the Country's' treasures and a *UNESCO World Heritage site*. Please contact me as soon as possible if you would like to join my trip to *KEW GARDENS* as there are now ONLY A FEW PLACES AVAILABLE.

Update from Alconbury Weald

It's been a busy start to the year at Alconbury Weald and we're looking forward to a dynamic 2019!

Alconbury Weald: Next steps

December saw a series of drop-in events to discuss the next key stages of development with residents of Alconbury Weald and the Stukeleys, which included:

- a new secondary school and special needs school to meet future education needs
- connections through Grange Farm to link Alconbury Weald to the A141 with prioritised bus and cycle connections to the new station, and a new road
- a Country Park area between the Stukeleys and the new development with wooded and open green space on Grange
- the next phases of housing and facilities.

With the new Local Plan identifying the potential for up to an additional 1,500 homes at Alconbury Weald, alongside the 5,000 already planned, these events also explored future expansion options.

Jobs and Skills update

Housebuilders and construction and infrastructure contractors from across the county are working with the Urban&Civic team to progress the formation of a Construction Skills Hub at Alconbury Weald, funded by the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB). The Hub will be part of the existing EDGE jobs brokerage in Huntingdonshire, which U&C run with partners to provide a one-stop shop to help local people get into work with construction companies and businesses on Alconbury Weald's growing Enterprise Zone.

The CITB funded training hub which is launching in April has been designed to directly support people looking to get into the construction industry and will focus on ex-service personnel and long term unemployed, as well as providing an opportunity for those who have not thought about a career in construction to try taster sessions, work placements and introductory training courses. The approach will offer classroom training alongside on the job experience in a specially designed construction skills hub, which sits close to the live sites of the 4 housebuilders currently on site at Alconbury Weald. Fake TV Licensing emails

An ongoing TV Licensing phishing campaign, first identified by the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) in September 2018, continues to be reported to Action Fraud in high numbers. Fraudsters are sending the public fake TV Licensing emails that are designed to steal their personal and financial information. Since April 2018, Action Fraud has received over 900 crime reports with victim losses totalling more than £830,000.

How you can protect yourself:

- Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails and never respond to messages that ask for your personal or financial details.
- Don't assume a phone call or email is authentic, even if someone knows your basic details (such as your name or address). Remember, criminals can spoof phone numbers and email addresses to appear as companies you know and trust, such as TV Licensing.
- Your bank will never call and ask you for your PIN, full banking password, or ask you to transfer money out of your account.

What to do if you've fallen victim:

- Let your bank know as soon as possible and monitor your bank statements regularly for any unusual activity.
- If you suspect your identity may have been stolen you can check your credit file quickly and easily online. Use a reputable service provider and follow up on any unexpected or suspicious results.
- If you have been a victim of fraud or cyber crime, report it to Action Fraud at actionfraud.police.uk, or by calling 0300 123 2040.







Twitter account launched for rural crime team

Creating a safer Cambridgeshire






