It was agreed that a rolling fund of £10.000 should be put aside for minor road repairs that are not considered essential by the Highways Dept. This work to be carried out by Highways Dept. contractors and paid for from this fund.

Both villages have been recipients of ongoing Community Infrastructure Levy [CIL] funded projects, some of the most recent being the re sanding, sealing and marking out of a Badminton court in Great Stukeley [GS] village hall and the resurfacing of the footpath leading from Church Way Little Stukeley[LS].

From March we will see new grass cutting contractors in the villages. The contract was put out to tender and local company BEAM have been appointed for the next three years to cut and maintain verges, play areas and church yards.

A speed table has been proposed on the entrance to GS heading North and before the remodelled junction at Church Way and Ermine St. also a new gateway features, like those in the Alconbury's, are to be installed at either end of both villages. Costs to be shared equally between Urban and Civic [U&C] and SPC.

SPC are aware of the concerns of some motorists regarding the new traffic layout but feel that, if signs and road markings are correctly observed, there should be no issues. Similar junctions are in use locally in for example Caxton Village and Upwood Rd in Ramsey.

The Neighbourhood Plan remains on the agenda, SPC now has a proposal to outsource the Project Managers position to expediate the process.

Letter to the Editor

Hi Martyn,

I hope I find you well.

I read with great interest my learned Friend Philip Hobson comments in the last issue, I would however venture that the measures taken were primarily in order to dissuade motorists from using the route and encourage travel on the A.14 spur, I do agree that the southern junction at Great Stukeley does pose significant danger aspects, not helped by the high nature of the adjacent hedge at the entrance to Church Road making it a 'blind' corner, but one wonders whether increased signage will have the desired effect, in my experience you can erect all the signs you like, but whether anyone will follow them is debatable!! For example, there are adequate signs at both ends of the C.339 showing there is a seven-ton limit apart from access along the road through our villages. Last summer Margaret and I followed a huge low loader through the villages, reported registration number to the police, they said investigation revealed a hire lorry so driver not traceable, not enough resources to investigate further. Just prior to Christmas we followed a police vehicle through the villages who in turn was following a large articulated lorry, they followed all the way to the new base entrance where they turned off leaving the HGV to continue on his way!! Only last week I met a fully laden car transporter travelling from the north through the villages, and this morning we were met by a huge livestock transporter advancing through the village of Little Stukeley. The annoying point is the police always say they have insufficient resources to monitor the C.339, but interestingly they seem to have sufficient resources to sit on the Low Road Flyover for hours on a weekly basis in their efforts to try and nab unsuspecting motorists for speeding, that effort is so obviously far more 'rewarding' !!
