



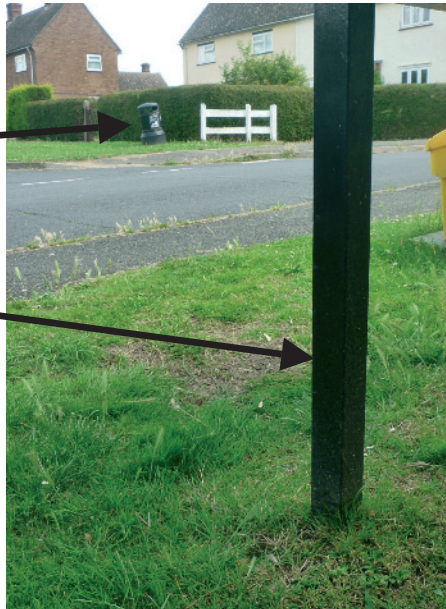

THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Prior to the Parish Council Meeting, 11 members of the public attended the July Parish Council Open Surgery this month, they expressed their concerns on a variety of subjects. The Parish Council was pleased to see such an attendance. The next Parish Council Open Surgery will be held, before the Parish Council Meeting, at 7:15pm on the 4th August; all parishioners are invited to express their support, views and concerns on issues affecting the Parish. The Parish Council looks forward to seeing you.

At the Parish Council Meeting held at Great Stukeley Village Hall on the 7th July 2014, 7 Parish Councillors, 1 County Councillor, 1 District Councillor 1 Parish Clerk and 1 member of the public attended. Apologies were received from County Councillor Sir Peter Brown. District Councillor Keith Baker apologised for his non-attendance at the previous four meetings. He reported that there had been a big staff shakeup and with sharing services with other District Councils, these changes should enable Huntingdonshire District Council to make budget savings.

The consultation on the Huntingdonshire Local Development Scheme 2014 was discussed and as the scheme was only a simple revision outlining the delay in the progress of developing the Draft Local Plan there was no need to respond. The Planning Group reported on the Transport Strategy in Cambridgeshire Consultation and it agreed to advise Cambridgeshire County Council that The Stukeleys Parish Council strongly supported the proposed new route to be safeguarded for the A141 through the parish (in the area adjacent to the Ermine Business Park and the area known as "Northbridge") and that this should be the final limit of the built development of Huntingdon.

Three applicants applied to be considered to be co-opted to the vacant post of Parish Councillor. The Parish Council felt it was important to consider the skill sets of each applicant and also their experience of the village. There was also a desire to bring "new blood" to the Parish Council. After considerable discussion, Stef van den haak was duly elected and thereby co-opted to the Parish Council. The Parish Council felt that all the applicants had skills and enthusiasm that would have benefited the Parish and the Parish Council but there was only one vacancy to fill. The Parish Council would like to thank all the applicants for their interest. Councillor Karl Gasson was elected as the Parish Council Webmaster for the current year.

The Council will submit a bid to the Local Highways Improvement Scheme 2015-16 for partial funding for a new bus shelter in Little Stukeley. Other funding streams will also be investigated. The village's street furniture have been inspected and any required maintenance work will be carried out within the next few months. The general state of the villages was discussed and it was noted that a number of gardens and hedges needed attention. Also the gullies in Church Road, Great Stukeley are full of weeds and need to be cleared, as well as a hole in Church Close, Great Stukeley needs to be repaired and vegetation removed from around the 30 mph sign in Little Stukeley; the Parish Clerk will report these problems to CCC Highways.

The poor broadband download speed in the some parts of the villages was discussed and the Parish Council is to conduct a survey of broadband speeds available in the villages.

Two trees with broken branches in Great Stukeley Playing Fields are to be cleared. CCC Rights of Way are to be asked to clear footpaths 11 and 24 and to investigate the uneven surface of footpath 4. The tree seat has been installed in the Stukeley Allotments and now only awaits the planting of a tree. Grass is to be cut and strimmed around trees and the allotment perimeter. A communal central storage unit on the Stukeley Allotments is still being investigated and costed.

The quarterly Financial Statements were received and considered. The 2013-14 Internal Audit Report was reviewed and it was noted in the report that excellent progress on Council procedures

had been made during the transition period which had taken place since the appointment of the new clerk and the election of some new Councillors. Also mentioned in report was that the village magazine is now produced in colour and that there is now, no longer any danger of making a profit on this venture. The report also stated that the precept is now set at a realistic level.

The following planning applications were considered by the Parish Council:

- **10 Church Way, Little Stukeley – 1400767FUL** – Proposed single storey rear extension to replace existing flat roof projection. SPC resolved to recommend approval as the proposed extension would not have an adverse impact on the neighbours, neighbourhood or the street scene.
- **Church Cottage, Church Way, Little Stukeley – 1400976FUL** – Erection of extension following demolition of existing conservatory and installation of 1st floor window to front. SPC resolved to recommend approval as the proposed extension would not have an adverse impact on the neighbours, neighbourhood or the street scene.
- **Land North of 13 Moorfield Way, Great Stukeley – 1400909FUL** – Proposed 3 bedroom detached dwelling with double garage. SPC resolved to recommend refusal as there was inadequate assurance that drainage arrangements on the site had been satisfactory dealt with and because the proposed building would be overbearing and incompatible with its surroundings. However, the Parish Council would recommend approval for a single storey dwelling when the drainage issues had been resolved.

Tim Salter gave an update on the Alconbury Weald development. Tim Salter is an independent Planning Consultant engaged to advise the Parish Council on various planning applications and issues affecting the Alconbury Weald development. His appointment arose out of a Parish Council initiative and after much negotiation was engaged with no cost to the Parish Council. Urban & Civil have recently renewed Tim Salter's contract to support the Parish Council for another year

A Thank You to Mike Newman

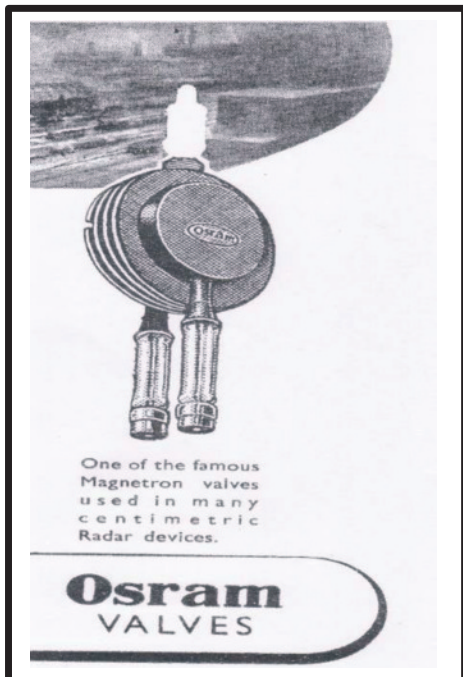

Hampton Court Palace - Tuesday 16th September 2014

In 1537 Jane Seymour gave birth to the future King Edward VI at HAMPTON COURT PALACE. The baby prince was christened in the magnificent Chapel Royal a few days later. Jane fell ill after Edward's birth and died at the palace only two weeks after giving birth to the new heir.

Henry VIII spent three of his honeymoons at HAMPTON COURT PALACE as did his daughter Mary I when she married Philip of Spain. It was at Hampton Court that Henry VIII was told of Kathryn Howard's infidelity which led to her arrest and execution. According to some this is why her ghost inhabits the Haunted Gallery.

Henry also married his sixth wife, Katherine Parr, in the Holyday, or Queen's Closet, which adjoins the Chapel Royal at the Palace.

Edward VI, Mary I and Elizabeth I all stayed at HAMPTON COURT PALACE at times during their reigns, although none made the significant additions and alterations at the Palace as had their father.

The Stukeleys WI recipe corner

Following last month's Tuna Plait, we reproduce the recipe for Nottingham Gingerbread from The Stukeleys Women's Institute book of recipes published in 1988. Your feedback would be appreciated by emailing thestukeleyswi@hotmail.co.uk

NOTTINGHAM GINGERBREAD

8oz plain flour
3-4 level tsp ground ginger
1 level tsp bicarbonate of soda
4oz butter or margarine
4oz brown sugar
8oz golden syrup or black treacle or half of each
¼ pint milk

1 egg

Method

Grease a 7" square tin and line with greaseproof paper. Sieve the flour, ginger and bicarbonate together in a mixing bowl.

Melt the fat with sugar, syrup and milk over a low heat, stirring all the time. Allow to cool a little. Beat the egg. Add liquid mixture with the egg to the dry ingredients. Mix well and beat for 5 minutes. Pour into the tin and spread evenly.

Cook in a slow oven (gas 2/ 315°F) for about 1 hour or until it is springy and leaving the sides of the tin.

Turn out carefully, remove paper and store for a few days to let it become sticky.

On behalf of CPRE, I am delighted to be able to invite you to join us to appreciate the grounds of Farm Hall in Godmanchester, by kind permission of Professor and Mrs Marcial Echenique. Refreshments will be provided.

This is a rare opportunity to view the gardens and grounds of this lovely Eighteenth Century house dating from 1746, but which also has a claim to fame as the location for Operation Epsilon where after the Second World war ten German scientists were detained who were thought to have worked on Nazi Germany's nuclear program. They were interned at Farm Hall (which was "bugged") from July 3, 1945 to January 3, 1946 to determine how close Nazi Germany had been to constructing an atomic bomb by listening to their conversations.

Dr Richard Hewlings from English Heritage will give a short talk about the importance of the house and its grounds, and we will be able to observe how it fits into this quintessential English landscape. There will also be opportunities for guided tours of the gardens and grounds.

I hope you will be able to join us at this event for which admission is by ticket only. Tickets are priced at £17.50 per person and further details are set out on the accompanying reply slip.

Dog Control Orders

Huntingdonshire District Council has introduced Dog Control Orders under section 55 of the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005. The new orders were made on 15 November 2007 and came into force on 15 December 2007.

Public consultation on the orders was carried out from 1 August 2007 to 30 September 2007 and all responses and representations were considered before the orders were duly made. A copy of the consultation summary can be seen by following the link.

The new Dog Control Orders are considered necessary and proportionate to local circumstances and replace the previous system of byelaws and orders for the control of dogs and also the designations made under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996, which has been repealed.

The land to which the Dog Control Orders apply is specified within the schedule to each of the orders and in the associated maps which can be viewed by following the links.

In preparing the new orders the Council has repeated the level of control established under the previous system and extended them as necessary where, for instance, new residential development has occurred or local parks or play areas have been expanded. Town and Parish Councils have been consulted throughout the process of making the orders.

The new orders have the same effect as the previous controls but are backed up by higher fixed penalties of £75 (or £50 if paid within ten days). In the Magistrates' Court, the penalty for conviction of an offence is a maximum fine of level 3 on the standard scale (currently £1000).

The effect of the orders is that any person in charge of a dog on land covered by a Dog Fouling Control Order must clean up any faeces deposited by the dog. Dogs must be kept on a lead in defined areas of the District and dogs are banned from certain sensitive areas of the District such as children's play areas. Authorised officers will also be able to direct any person in charge of a dog on land covered by a Dogs on Leads by Direction Order to put and keep a dog on a lead where such restraint is considered to be reasonably necessary.

The Dog Control Orders (Prescribed Offences and Penalties, etc) Regulations 2006 provide for five offences which may be prescribed in Dog Control Orders as follows:

- failing to remove dog faeces;
- not keeping a dog on a lead;
- not putting, and keeping, a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer;
- permitting a dog to enter land from which dogs are excluded;
- taking more than a specified number of dogs onto land.

The District Council has elected to make orders for the first four offences listed above.

PARISH BROADBAND SURVEY

The Government has a stated commitment to improving national broadband service .The 2014 goal is to provide two-thirds of all homes and businesses access to superfast broadband .

The final third, properties in rural areas, will be covered through Broad Band Delivery UK which has set aside £530 million in public funding to meet this challenge.

BT is the sole contractor nation-wide and will receive £6.75 million from the Government to provide superfast connections in the Cambridge and Peterborough areas.BT has recently completed laying fibre optic cables through Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley along Ermine Street.

While there are reports that some residents in both Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley are receiving an improved service many others are not and that broadband speeds and connectivity vary widely throughout our Parish.None of the dwellings in either Great Stukeley or Little Stukeley can be considered remote as all are less than half a mile from Ermine Street.

Your Parish Council believes that ALL parishioners, businesses and farms located in Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley deserve to receive the same levels of service. To make an effective representation the Parish Council needs to demonstrate a significant variability in broadband performance across both Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley and requests YOUR help in completing a very simple survey. This should take less than 5 minutes of your time.

We need five pieces of information to complete our survey.Note that we do NOT need your name, or telephone number.

1. BROADBAND SPEED:

- log onto *www.thinkbroadband.com* using Google or another search engine
3rd panel down on left, press *Speed Test*
- This will show a large black/red centre panel, *enter* your postcode and whether or not your computer is using Wi-Fi,press *Start*

- test should take about 60 seconds
- You will see a large black panel with with six sets of numbers above two graphs. We need two sets of numbers from you:
 - Top left-hand side in green Avg. TBB *DOWNLOAD*
 - Top right-hand side in blue Avg *TBB UPLOAD*
 (You can send in longhand or right hand click & paste the results)

1. LOCATION:

We need *your street and village* (ie Low Road, Little Stukeley) so that we can identify speed variations across the villages.

2. SUPPLIER:

To identify variations between suppliers and their services we need to know:

- Your *internet supplier's name* (ie Aol, BT, Sky etc)
- If you purchase a *fibre optic package* (ie BT Affinity etc).

We urge all computer-owning parishioners, businesses and farms located in Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley to participate in this survey as the more examples we can provide the stronger case we can present.

Remember: *superfast broadband access is now critical to your children's' education, to enable you to work remotely from home, and for access to public services, information and entertainment. Slow broadband speed is now no longer acceptable.*

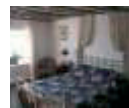

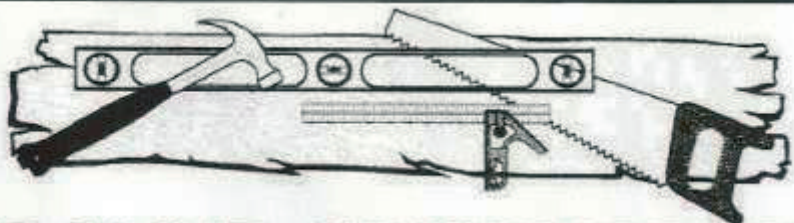
