# THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Stukeleys Parish Council met on Monday 3 Jul 2017 at Little Stukeley Village Hall. Please check the Parish Council's website and Notice Boards for the Minutes. Please note, that Parish Council do not meet in August. Therefore, the next Parish Council meeting is on Mon 4 Sep 17 only.

Parish Council welcomed a new Parish Councillor Mr Shaun Burton who joined the Council on 3 Jul 17. There are no more Vacancies on the Parish Council.

Rebecca Britton and her colleague from Urban & Civic, attended the Council meeting and provided an update on Alconbury Weald development.

New Planning Applications:

*17/00941/HHFUL Construction of a single storey rear extension 23 Church Way, Little Stukeley PE28 4BQ.* HDC received further information in connection with this planning application.

PC agreed to recommend approval to this planning application because it is compatible with local street scene and is of an acceptable use.

*17/01238/LBC 1 Low Road, LS, PE28 4BA, Internal alterations to create en-suites to bedrooms 1 and 4. (This planning application received after the Agenda was circulated)*  
PC decided to delegate powers to Planning Committee to submit planning recommendations to HDC on PC behalf.

It was also agreed that Cllr Sally Smith will chair Planning committee meetings.

Jennifer Thomas Consultancy Ltd: The Stukeley's Parish Neighbourhood Plan: Agreserves Land.

The report presented to PC. Jenifer Thomas Consultancy Ltd could provide help towards the production of the NP. £8000 is ring fenced for communities to use. Cllr DR is happy to talk to Jenifer Thomas Consultancy Ltd.

4 new consultations from Huntingdonshire District Council were received on the day of Parish Council meeting:

It was agreed to delegate powers to Planning Committee to deal with 4 planning consultations received today, consultation period is 3 Jul to 25 Aug 17:

- 1) Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment 2017
- 2) Call for Sites 2017
- 3) Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: Draft Final Sustainability Appraisal
- 4) Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: Consultation Draft 2017

PC delegated powers to Planning Committee to submit recommendations on PC behalf.

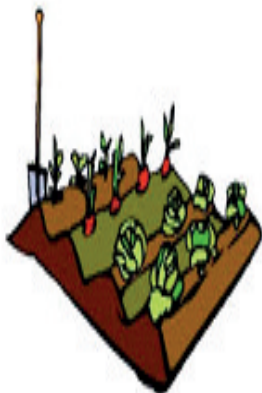

# **Great Stukeley Open Gardens**

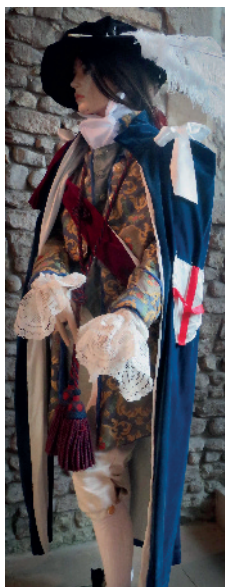

## **Alconbury Weald holds first community fete**

The new community continues to develop at pace, with a new park opening up in July, providing a Multi-Use Games Area, skate park, and play area, along with future allotments for new residents. The skatepark was launched last month with a session of skateboard lessons, put on for the Ermine Street Church Academy pupils. The Skate Park is located in the Community Park at Alconbury Weald, past Ermine Street Church Academy and is open daily from 8am to 10pm. It can be used by skateboards, bikes and scooters and users must wear safety helmet, protective clothing and pads. Introduction sessions and lessons are available from Lets Go Skate through the summer, with information available from <http://www.letsgoskate.co.uk/>.

Alongside the Community Park, Alconbury Weald has opened its first shop – Swynford Stores. The shop will initially open Monday to Friday from 7.30am - 1pm and on Saturdays from 8am-12.30pm and will extend its hours in response to demand and as the community grows. Run by Adrian and Samantha Wardman – the team behind the successful Abbots Ripton Village Store - the shop will also provide information to the new community about events and local services, supported by Alconbury Weald's new Community lead Steph Burton.

Steph said:

“This is a really exciting time to be joining the Community team of Urban&Civic and my job will be to work with new residents to support them set down roots, and oversee the roll-out of facilities for them and for the local area. Ensuring that new residents get to know each other, our local neighbours, and the huge range of local activities, clubs and services across the local area is a fundamental part of creating not just new homes but communities people want to call home.”

“We hope facilities such as the shop, parks and play areas bring in our neighbours and provide all the villages locally with new facilities that can be enjoyed.”

The new park and the plaza at the front of Ermine Street Church Academy were transformed on Friday 7 July, as Alconbury Weald held its first community fete for new residents, businesses and neighbours. The event saw a range of activities and displays put on by partners involved in the development and new residents, including giant puzzles and games, drum workshops provided by Cambridgeshire Music Service, a Jazzercise “taster” session, a Smoothie Bike: for children to make their own fruity concoctions and whizz them up by pedal power, as well as cake stalls, hot dogs and candy floss. Additional music was provided by The Huntingdon Male Voice Choir.

A range of partners also provided information about local services to support families moving in, Children Centre support, local police services and crime reduction support, and local leisure activities including information and equipment examples from the One Leisure gyms, the St Neots Bowmen and SOKE Target club – all based within the development. The event was decorated by bunting produced by local residents, children from Ermine Street Church Academy and the Alconbury Brownies.

Steph added:

“This is the first time we have brought everyone together, in what we hope will be the first of many events for and with the new community. The Urban&Civic team are so chuffed to see all of the design, landscaping and buildings that we have been working on being enjoyed and valued by our new community, and we are so grateful to all the partners, residents and businesses who played their part in making this event happen.”

Over in The Club, The Café remains a busy location for people dropping in for coffee and cake and hot and cold food and drinks, with all welcome to enjoy the tasty fare on offer from Ryan Kitson and his team.

Membership of the Gym – which is exclusive to residents of Alconbury Weald, The Alconburys, the Stukeleys, Abbots Ripton and Woodwalton – continues to rise, with a Summer offer available of a 90 day training plan and access to all the facilities, with no contract and no joining fee, all for £90. The gym have also launched a series of classes running lunchtime and evenings for Circuit training, cycling, strength training, pilates and High Impact training. More information at

### **Mr Pernickety Visits: `The Porterhouse` Free House, Earith Road, Willingham**

I visited the `Porterhouse` Free House as I had been told of its delights. The pub is situated on the main cross roads in Willingham with handy traffic lights on the corner allowing an easy entrance and egress from the establishment. The building itself is a very typical late fifties build with nothing of architectural merit. The car park has ample room and the gardens extend around three sides of the building giving the opportunity for outside conviviality if you were to so wish. The pub also has two rooms to let for overnight stays.

The interior of the pub is broken into a dining area and a drinking area and was found to be clean with tables well spaced. The drinking area was made to welcome any passing stranger with or without dogs with a real fire in evidence and indeed a hearty welcome was shown to my companion and I by `Jan` the owner and head cook. When we visited the pub was moderately busy with chaps (and dogs) having a beer and with couples and families eating meals. The interior is done out like a gentleman's club with a bent towards hunting in the broadest sense. Old muskets and trophies line the walls.

At last my eye caught what I had heard off; the six gravity fed beer taps behind the bar serving a selection of real ales direct from the cask. No gas input here, just the downward trickle of the nectar into the glass. Lovely! The ales all looked good, being bright and clear with the Taurus ale being the best of the lot. My companion was also happy, there being a large selection of craft Gins available.

We decided to sample the food and we were not to be disappointed. The beef stew was full of flavour, had a rich gravy and had the right ratio of meat & veg. My companion's dish of a stuffed chicken fillet with a crisp salad was also found to be of a high quality. I also noted that both dishes were on a `Slimming World` listing for the weight conscious!

So in short with the mess that the A14 is in at present, and is to be so for some years to come, take the easy detour from Cambridge to Huntingdon Via Willingham and St Ives and stop off for a short R&R; `The Porterhouse` will suit the need with an excellence.
