It was also noted that Bloor Development (1100 properties) in Huntingdon Town boundary and Savills (500 properties) planned to be built in Parish Boundary. Huntingdon Town Council arranged the meeting with The Stukeleys Parish Council to discuss the joint ideas.

The Great Planning Betrayal of The Stukeleys

In 2014, just five years ago, Huntingdonshire District Council granted outline planning permission on the former Alconbury Airfield for some 5,000 new dwellings and 8,000 jobs. The planning application had received remarkably few major objections; most local people saw the sense of making good use of a site already damaged by military development but they were also influenced by the promise in the masterplan of large scale open space which would keep the proposed development separate from Huntingdon and the villages of Great and Little Stukeley.

The District Council's latest Local Plan proposes a further 1,500 homes on the Alconbury Weald site, "subject to capacity". This has now been translated into a planning application by Urban&Civic, the developers of the site, which would lead to a reduction in size of that open space, so that its effective area is less than half that originally put forward and, crucially, would not maintain separation between Huntingdon and Alconbury Weald, so that you would have no idea as to which of those places you were in or where one began and the other ended. There would be a continuous sprawl of development starting in the south at Huntingdon town centre and running north-westwards for some 5 to 6 miles.

The concept of Alconbury Weald being a new separate community with an individual identity would be lost in this suburban sprawl. Those of us who supported the original concept saw Alconbury Weald as another Brampton or Godmanchester - individual places, not part of Huntingdon and clearly separate from the town although using some of the town's services and facilities. This concept, respecting the character of the Huntingdon area, would be lost if these plans go through.

It has been suggested by some that the new Local Plan protects The Stukeleys. Well, it's worth reflecting on the scale of what is proposed:

On Alconbury Weald and Grange Farm - 6,500 homes

On RAF Alconbury - 1,680 homes

On land off Ermine Street south of Great Stukeley - 1,440 homes.

That is a total of nearly 10,000 houses within and immediately adjacent to the Parish. Note that this is likely to be **22,000 people** - compare this with the population of Huntingdon at the last census in 2011- only slightly more at 23,732.

Whilst having the Local Plan in place might protect the wider District, it is stretching the point to suggest that the Parish of the Stukeleys is "protected" by cramming so much development into one location and by offering a much-diminished rump of a country park.

The good folk of The Stukeleys should indeed feel that they have been betrayed by broken promises.

Council Launches Review of Polling Districts and Polling Stations

Comments are being sought from residents and interested groups on a review of the existing polling districts and polling places situated within the Huntingdonshire area.

The District Council is looking for feedback on any aspect of polling districts and/or polling places currently used and invites representation and comments from interested persons, especially from an access point of view.

There is a requirement for the District Council to complete a full review of all polling district and polling places every five years, to make sure arrangements are as convenient as possible for any future elections or referendums.

Jo Lancaster, Managing Director and Returning Officer for the District Council said "We're asking community groups and individuals to provide as much information as they can about their current polling station, including issues such as location, parking and disability access and whether they are aware of any other suitable premises that could be used for polling duties."

The closing date for comments is 14th August 2019.

The feedback received will inform the final recommendations which will be presented to the Council in October 2019.
