

National Service Remembered

I was most likely the last National Serviceman from either Great or Little Stukeley. I was deferred because of my Apprenticeship to J. Hedges Stapp. By the time I got my 'call up' papers, June 1960, I was married with a baby daughter, Lucy. I was not looking forward to the experience. I got my travel warrant and went by green bus from Huntingdon to Cardington. I got off the bus at the gates to Cardington and went to the guard room. First mistake, I should have gone by train, so would have to wait there for the buses to arrive with rest 'of the rabble'. When they arrived and a 'little man' was shouting out names with their and bed number. We collected bedding and were shown how to make a bed pack, them to NAFFI to get a meal. All the RAF 'bods' went home and left us to our misery. Next morning all hell broke loose, we had to walk along a long bench to collect gear. We each got, one hat for the use of, boots, great coat, shirts, pants, gloves, shoes, loose collars, studs, kit bags which we had to stuff everything in. Back to hut and shown how to put it all away. It was Friday 3pm, so again all the RAF bods went home for the weekend. Luckily we had one or two boys who had been in the Cadets. They told us how to clean/polish boot, buttons and webbing etc. Then we had to get our 'Civvies' together ready to send home. We spent the next two weeks doing a bit of Square Bashing, and running about in our new sports kit. One activity was playing 'murder Ball' in one of the big 'Airship' hangers on the base. Imagine 140 lads, in two teams, trying to get the ball, 3ft diameter and very heavy, over to the other side first!! No wonder it was called Murder Ball!

Day 14 we put our kit together and marched (sort of) to Cardington's own Railway Station. Get on the VERY old steam train, with kit bags and food parcels and off we trundled at about 20mph. We stopped three times for 'Loo' and where we got drinks. We headed to Bridgenorth, Shropshire, which was a mystery to us all. We went through Severn Valley just as sun was setting, and up to Bridgenorth High Town. Busses and lorries waiting for us, we piled on and went to RAF Bridgenorth. At guard room, stopped near parade ground, where all hell broke loose again as names were called, kit bags found, given hut number and bed space. DON'T walk on parade ground, that was Holy of Holies!!! 'Last Post' was playing, STOP where you are, Stand to attention and face flag pole. The bus could have stopped close to the huts, but then we wouldn't have learnt about the 'Holy of Holies'.

In the huts, we were taught how to do bed packs. Sheet folded to the thickness of an old 3d piece. Blanket a mug wide, and one blanket wrapped

around the pack. The locker door was open showing all the shirt collars ironed and folded. Also on the top shelf were gloves, t-shirts and pants. Folded shirts and shoes/boots etc and uniform on coat hangers. Great coat at the back of the bed. The peaked hat on the top of the wardrobe, the peak had to overhang, the size of a 3d piece (that **** 3d piece again). All bed squares had to be polished, bed feet all in a line down the hut. An officer, would look down the line and if one was out of place would tip everything on the floor. WE THEN HAD TO DO IT ALL AGAIN. We had to stand, silently, at attention while this was going on. The O'C mob would walk out laughing. The hut Cpl told us it all had to be cleared up and sorted by 8am the next day. All sorted, at 4pm, don't touch the bed, sleep on the floor.

Next morning more 'B*** S***', get polished, get dressed, breakfast don't forget fighting irons(cutlery) and mug, back to hut. Cpl sitting on a bed, said O'C had been around, all OK. Change into working kit, was same as best as RAF was getting rid of N/S blues. Boots on last, buffing the outside. March (hmm) to square and go right around. Shouting by drill Cpl's, do this, do that, feet all move together. 'You tall twits to the left and little squirts to the right'. So now we know where to stand, back to hut for mug for morning tea. If you were last in line you had time for two sips if you were lucky. Back to hut, bull boots, run back to square. Left, right, back, side march all use left feet together. STOP you useless mob, he's got two left feet. Cpl get something and scratch his left boot cap with an 'L'. Make sure the boot is polished by morning, you'll never forget left again.

This continued for another nine weeks. We did get the hang of it in the end. We had one lad in our hut who could not clean boots for toffee. |We put him on window cleaning and 'rubbish pick up' duty. We all did what we were best at, and therefore had been made into a good team, which was the aim of our ten weeks Basic Training. Out Hut won 'Best Hut' for the Cpl.

One day we were called to the hanger and told to pick our jobs (what we wanted) and put them on our form. No one got what they wanted, surprise surprise!! We were assigned various jobs and bases, I got Honington, Suffolk, as a cook. NOT bad as close to home.

A day or so later we had our Pass Out Parade, my wife came, and then we were free for three weeks. Total Joy!!!

Overall, National Service was not too bad, and made Men out of Boys, who knew what discipline was, and how to behave.

Mr Pernickety Visits: The Mermaid, Ellington, Just off the A14

The pub is an early 1600's building being timber framed and plastered to the front which originally jettied to the street, with a late 1600's painted brick extension. There is also a part of a late 1300's building incorporated into the later building. The pub name comes from the old ships' timbers used in its construction. The ancient beams of the building provide character and warmth to create a great atmosphere. In its more recent history WWII American bomber aircrew hammered nickels and dimes into the cracks of the beams as a token of good luck before embarking on their missions – hoping to retrieve them on their return, and buy a pint! The coins are still there as many did not return from their last mission.

The pub is a free house and with a Michelin starred chef at the helm its food is what you would expect; arty but delicious with just the right amount served.

Upon my arrival on a Thursday evening it was noted there was a great atmosphere with a fair number of locals standing at the bar drinking from a good selection of real cask ales. The pub also has an extensive listing of good wines by the glass on offer as well as a wonderful selection of gins; my own village Inn could take a lesson from this! To top it off you had 20 tapas to choose from and eat at the bar; excellent! There was also a real fire in the grate to warm yourself by. The front bar also had several tables and even at 18-30hrs some were occupied by early diners. There are further tables to eat from in the rear of the pub which I have to say would be better for a quiet romantic meal as the atmosphere would lend itself to such. Three of the tables allow you to look into the spotless kitchen through a glass partition to watch your food being prepared.

As it was a Thursday it was `Curry challenge` night and for £16 I had the following; East Indian charred mackerel, with spiced lentils & garlic yoghurt; Keralan rich beef curry, with fresh ginger& plum tomatoes and finally Thai Kale & Peanut Curry, with ginger, chilli, bok choy & soy all with breads and rice. I had Tiger beer at £2 a bottle. A full blown a la carte meal would cost around £40 per head, not cheap but worth it. In fact I would rather go here than the fabled Bridge Hotel.

Go, it's a delightful, mouth-watering experience!! I shall certainly return.

Mr Pernickety Visits: The Stukeleys Inn, Great Stukeley Village, Huntingdon

Formerly a farmhouse with piggery attached it is now a restaurant and inn. Built in the early 18thC and of red brick incorporating an earlier timber framed house on site. Internally fragments of timber framing are visible in the rear wall. There is an inglenook hearth sadly with a gas fire installed. The premises have been under new management for the last few months and some changes have been made to the interior furniture placements with soft furnishings added.

Upon my arrival last month it was noted that the establishment was 'jaded' in its looks with one interior wall having peeling plaster work and the bar area having seen better days. There is a curious banquet seating arrangement near the bar with a two colour scheme which is reminiscent of what you would find in an Indian restaurants take away area. There was piped music playing from a national radio station.

The clientele at 19-00hrs was sparse with three at the bar and two more in the lower seating area. The barman Russell was well presented and had a good manner and obviously knew his job. The beers on offer were uninspiring being various kegs of dubious reputation plus Green King IPA and a guest ale. Neither of the cask ales was in tip top condition upon serving with the wines on offer best being left in the bottle! The atmosphere was totally lacking.

The food on offer was standard pub grub, steady but uninspiring although I have to note that there is a new chef in residence and I was told that he is looking to introduce a more eclectic and wider menu. I declined to eat.

By 20-00hrs the five original clientele had been swelled by several diners from the nearby air base. They seemed to be the core users of the pub as my enquiries elicited that the pub itself was not frequented by many villagers which is a shame. "Use it or lose it" comes to mind.

This establishment will be visited by Mr Pernickety again in the coming months to see if any further improvements have been made.


