The Stukeleys Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 1 October 2018 at 7.15pm at Ermine Street Church Academy

There are only 2 Vacancies on the Parish Council now.

Little Stukeley residents attended the meeting and highlighted safety concerns about traffic calming measures at Little Stukeley. The road layout was described as confusing and the road markings and signage do not seem to be adequate. The issue was brought to U&C representative attention who attended the PC meeting.

Before commencement of business a minute silence was held in remembrance of past council member Mr Dave Hossack.

Parish Council discussed the following planning application and made planning recommendations to Huntingdonshire District Council:

1) Application for approval of appearance, layout, landscaping and scale - in respect of the construction of 189 homes, pocket park, associated highways, landscaping and ancillary works (submitted under condition 15/18 of outline planning permission 1201158OUT). Site Address: Parcel 5 Senliz Road Alconbury Weald Reference: 18/02223/REM
PC considers that this application is in accordance with the design code and planning conditions.

2) Reserved matters (appearance, access, landscaping, layout and scale) in respect of the construction of a new highway to form part of a link from the A141 to key phase 1 and all associated works'. Site Address: Land West Of The East Coast Mainline Railway And North Of Spittals Way Huntingdon Reference: 18/02275/REM
PC was not able to locate a key document on the website. This is a significant application and has implications for the southern access and transportation through the site and along Ermine St. It was recommended that PC requests an extension of time to enable PC to look at it properly and report to the next Committee meeting. PC agreed to seek for the advice and proposals.

3) 17/02513/FUL The erection of 3 x 4 bedroom dwellings, Land Opposite 91 Ermine Street Little Stukeley received. PC will draft a letter which will be submitted to HDC via complaints procedure.

4) Erection of new function room Site Address: Holiday Inn Thrapston Road Brampton Reference: 18/01609/FUL. Recommend Approval: As it has no obvious impact on the villages.

5) Rear extension consisting of a single storey flat roof 'orangery' and two storey flat roof area Site Address: 42 Low Road Little Stukeley Huntingdon Reference: 18/02000/HHFUL – Recommend Approval.

6) Reserved matters application for 192 dwellings for appearance, layout, scale, landscape and access in respect of Key Phase 1 pursuant to outline planning permission 1201158OUT. Site Address: Alconbury Airfield Ermine Street Little Stukeley Reference: 18/01536/REM. Dealt under Alconbury Weald Agenda item.

Recommend Approval: The Stukeleys Parish Council has already commented on the initial application for reserved matters and notes that the new consultation relates only to the subsequent additional information and amendments to the layout requested by HDC.

The amendments in Parish Council view are consistent with the outline permission and are appropriate in relation to improving the design.

The Stukeleys Parish Council would therefore recommend its support for the proposal and reiterates its recommendation of approval.

7) Erection of 4no. two-storey detached dwellings with ancillary garaging, parking, landscaping and access provisions. Site Address: Land North Of 13 Moorfield Way Great Stukeley Reference: 18/02056/FUL. PC agreed to Recommend Refusal: Because of the lay out and density of buildings, the site is inadequate for 4 homes and insufficient parking provided.

Further village maintenance and repairs are considered to be carried by Parish Council.

GREAT STUKELEY CHURCHYARD REGULATIONS

Following an update to Churchyard regulations by the Diocese of Ely we wish to bring to the attention of the families with loved ones buried in St Bartholomew's church yard the following regulations:

FLOWERS AND OTHER MEMORABILIA

35. Trees, shrubs and flowers may be planted on or around a grave **only with separate Faculty permission**. Forms can be found on Ely Diocese web site or you can request appropriate forms from your Church Wardens.

36. No artificial flowers may be placed in the churchyard except for Remembrance Day poppies and traditional Christmas wreaths, and these should be removed within two months.

37. Wreaths and cut flowers must be removed as soon as they appear to be withered. Vases which are no longer in use must be removed.

38. No lighting, whether solar or otherwise, is permitted on or around the grave.

39. With the permission of the Minister, up to 3 toys or similar objects may be left at the place of burial or interment of cremated remains for a period of 12 months from the date of burial or interment but must be removed at the end of that period.

40. The PCC has authority to remove any artificial flowers, or other memorabilia which do not comply with these Regulations and which have not been authorised by Faculty.

We are aware that over time a number of families have planted flowers and trees on graves without requesting the appropriate permission and therefore the Church PCC wish to give notice that no further gardens may be planted unless the required permission has been granted. At this time we do not propose to ask those who already have gardens to seek a Faculty but we do give notice that should these gardens not be attended in a 2 month period, the PCC reserve the right to remove the garden and grass over the grave space.

Update from Alconbury Weald

Alconbury Weald community mark Remembrance Sunday in poignant ceremony

On Sunday (11 November) Alconbury Weald hosted its first Remembrance Day event, in honour of the British and American Service personnel from the former airfield who lost their lives in the service of their countries.

Over 60 people – including residents, representatives from the RAF and United States Visiting Forces (USVF), the new community's Brownies – the 2nd Alconbury Brownies – and children from the primary school's Hangar Club – formed a procession from the school where the children had created a poppy display in the community plaza – through the new homes to the Listed former Watch Office.

The Watch Office was historically used by RAF Command to overview the missions leaving the airfield and the Green outside is being established as a Memorial area, both to all those who served in the Second World War and the 19 young men who lost their lives there in May 1943 whilst aircraft were being prepared for a mission. The building is currently undergoing extensive refurbishment to become a community and heritage space and offices for our partner charity Groundwork East.

The service of reflection and prayer was followed by the laying of wreaths and concluded with the UK and US National Anthems. After the service, everyone stayed on for refreshments at The Café to share stories of friends and relatives who have served in the armed forces.

Alconbury Weald's Pioneer Minister Rev Rob Paddison added: "It was very moving to be able to bring such a new community, of all ages, together to remember the past, commemorate the loss of all those involved in war, and to renew our desire for peace. The Watch Office provided a poignant backdrop to the service, ensuring we remember both the 100 years since the end of the First World War, but also the contributions made by so many in the conflicts since then. It was also lovely to see so many children there and I was honoured to read a poem that the children of Ermine Street Church Academy had written during a week's reflection on remembrance."

Alongside the important heritage of Alconbury Weald, the new community continues to grow, and November also saw the launch of Civic Living Homes. The homes designed and delivered by Urban&Civic at the Gateway to the development offer a more contemporary design to complement the existing housebuilders, and create a seamless connection with the award-winning architecture of the office buildings along the Boulevard.

Civic Living offers a range of 2 and 3 bedroom houses and 1 and 2 bedroom apartments which reflect a contemporary desire for bespoke homes, with light-filled and free-flowing layout inside and using outdoor space in a creative way,

Alconbury Weald – Next Steps

Now that the first phase of development is well underway the team have been looking at taking forward the key next stages of the development, including some important delivery priorities such as:

- Delivery of the secondary school and Special Needs school
- Connection of the first phase of development to the Southern Gateway and the A141
- Delivery of the Country Park area for the Stukeleys, as a buffer between the villages and the new development
- The next phases of housing and facilities.

We felt it was a useful time to come back to the community, and also to engage new residents in the story so far, and to discuss together the next steps.

The events will enable us to show early thinking on the Country Park, which will be a wooded and open green space on Grange Farm. The Design Team have been working through some early thoughts with the Parish Council and now want to share those with the wider community.

They will also enable us to talk through the connections being planned through Grange Farm to connect Alconbury Weald to the A141 with prioritised bus and cycle connections to the new station, and a new road.

With the potential for more homes coming forward at Alconbury Weald in the next Local Plan period, we also want to explore the scenarios we have been looking at for how that works with the existing areas of development, safeguarding important green space, and ensuring the right level of facilities and infrastructure locally.

We are therefore holding a series of events in December as set out below:

- Friday 7 December, 4pm - 7pm, Little Stukeley Village Hall
- Saturday 8 December, 12.30pm – 4.30pm Great Stukeley Village Hall
- Saturday 15 December, 10am-3pm, The Club, Alconbury Weald

Please come along to these sessions to help us develop the best plans for these next steps and ensure they come forward in a way which maximises the benefits and minimises the impacts on local communities.

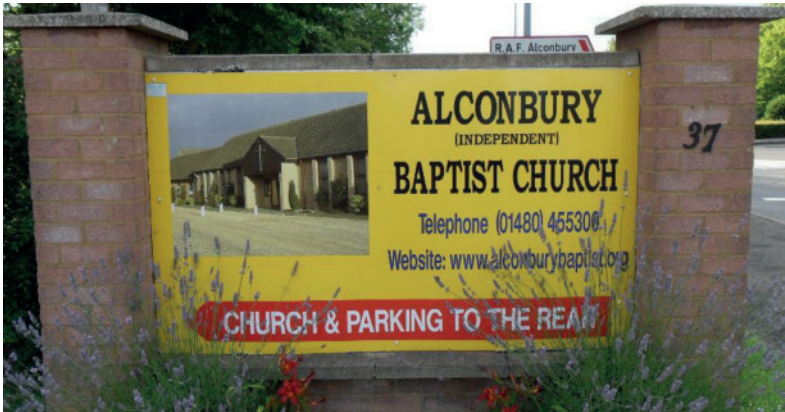
