





January Parish Council Meeting

Eight councillors, representatives from M/s Savills and Ms Rebecca Britton together with fourteen members of the public attended the January meeting of the Council. Savills addressed the meeting on the various changes they envisaged making to their original plans for the Washingley Farm Business Park following public consultation at two open meetings recently held within the Parish. There were many questions, the majority of which concerned issues of traffic generation and 'rat running' through the villages to the proposed new development. The meeting left the representatives from Savills in no doubt as to the high levels of concern about the proposals and the likely negative response it would receive to any planning application lodged. A request for a new bus shelter on the west side of Ermine Street in Little Stukeley was noted. Plans for the redevelopment of an industrial site with residential within Little Stukeley were refused on the grounds of overbearing size, however it was added that the Council would support housing redevelopment of the site providing the proposed houses were on a smaller scale. A questionnaire was to be drafted by the planning group in which residents were to be asked, what the social housing needs were within the parish, what and where would any future development be supported in the villages and finally any suggestions on what types of 'traffic calming' measures would be acceptable on Ermine Street through the villages in light of the proposed new developments in the immediate vicinity. Finally a new line had been agreed for the diversion of footpath 11 at Grange Farm, the clerk also reported applying for grant aid to refurbish footpath 13 at Great Stukeley. Quotes had been received for a new rabbit fence round the playing field and Mr. Vincent was to apply for lottery funding to finance the works.

The Council was now very close to agreeing the format of a new central building to service the new allotment area in Owl End after which a planning application was likely to be lodged. Also a lease agreement for the allotments and the community woodland was close to being agreed, all this in line with the Councils aims to start the project this Spring.

Overgrown hedges in both villages were to be reported by the clerk to the County Council with a view that a County Officer meets with our Highway Warden and the Clerk on site in an attempt to find a solution to the problem.

The Council once again has had reports of inconsiderate dog owners walking their dogs in the playing field and not clearing up after them, please be quite aware that NO PERSON has the right to excersise dogs in the area at any time. It is strongly suggested that any one seeing dogs in the field, take a picture if possible and then report to the clerk or any council member. Also it is an offence to allow dogs to run free inside the 30mph boundaries of either village, unfortunately it is reported that some residents appear to let their dogs out of their homes to wander and foul as they will, then fetch them in. DOG OWNERS PLEASE BE MORE RESPONSIBLE.

The next Council meeting will be on Monday 4^{th} February 2013 at 7.30pm at the village hall, Low Road Little Stukeley.

Community Wood

Planting of the Community Wood in Owl End has started. On Friday 11th January Amrita Huggins and Bridget Halford from the Huntingdonshire District Council together with Ken and I spent the morning setting out canes prior to the real work beginning. The site is at the western end of the allotment site. (See plan in Paul's article)

At 10.00 am on the Saturday 22 volunteers set out, armed with spades to plant various trees adjacent to the canes, the field had recently been ploughed and was heavy going but by 12 o'clock the majority of the work had been done, we had planted approximately 320 native trees and shrubs ranging from oak, maple, bird cherry down to blackthorn and hawthorn. All that remains to be done in that section is to put in some tree mats and guards at a later date. I thank all those who turned up for a sterling effort, and for those that volunteered but could not make the date, there will be more to come I will be in touch.

Progress with the Allotments project

It's taken time to work through the many issues but we now have plans that meet all the main requirements.

Urban & Civic's landscape consultants have been working on the layout of the site, which includes the Community Wood that volunteers have been planting (see Sue's article in this issue). A provisional plan is overleaf and shows the main features and the imaginative configuration of the plots.

We are very grateful to U&C for making the land available, the services of their designers and for finding other local experts who are prepared to work on the project without payment:

Hunt & Coombs Solicitors are advising us on the leases Waterland Associates (Architects) have designed a "clubhouse" - more details in this issue

Quantity surveyor CCM Associates are preparing cost estimates for the clubhouse



Police warning after burglary spate continues

In October officers issued a warning and since that time there have been more than 80 burglaries in the town and surrounding villages, with the majority of offences happening during the day.

Villages targeted are Eaton Socon, Eaton Ford, Southoe, Little Paxton, Great Staughton, Buckden, Toseland and Perry.

Detective Inspector Jon McAdam said: "In the past few months we have seen a rise in burglaries in the town and surrounding area which we believe may be part of a series.

"The majority of offences are happening during the day with offenders targeting homes while people are working.

"Local officers are working with the force's tactical team and traffic officers to increase patrols in the targeted areas and work is ongoing to trace those responsible and we have made several arrest in recent weeks.

"The public also play an important role and I would urge people to remain vigilant to activity in their neighbourhood, reporting anything out of the ordinary or suspicious to police."

To reduce the risk of becoming a victim:

- -It's important to make your home look lived in and ask neighbours to keep an eye on it when you are not in. Consider installing light timers. Burglars will target homes in darkness as there is less of a risk of being spotted. If the bins are due to be collected, ask your neighbours to move them on and off your drive for you.
- Report unusual activity such as people knocking at your door. If you believe someone knocking at your door could be a burglar then contact police immediately. This type of information can be used to gain a better understanding of how criminals are operating in your area.
- Keep a note of any unusual vehicles parking in your area and pass information to the police.

Deterrents:

Alarms: Install an alarm - even an empty box on the side of your home can be enough to put off a burglar.

Dogs: A 'beware of the dog' sign can be enough to put off an intruder, regardless of whether a dog is present

Lock up your shed: Offenders do not like carrying break-in tools as they may be searched en-route to a burglary. They often raid sheds to get their hands on tools to burgle.

Strong communities are also a deterrent for burglars: Make friends with your neighbours or join your local Neighbourhood Watch scheme.




