





THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Even though Parish Council do not meet in January due to planning applications and consultations received from HDC, - Parish Council had to set an extraordinary Parish Council Meeting on 5 January 2017, where these planning issues were discussed:

New Planning Applications:

16/02553/REM: Application for approval of appearance, landscaping, layout, access and scale in respect of the construction of new Community Building and Allotment Building in the KP1 Community Park including associated ancillary works. Alconbury Weald Ermine Street Little Stukeley – received 9 Dec 16, extension gained till 5 Jan 17

Recommend approval: The Stukeleys Parish Council is pleased to see the development progress of the Community Building and Allotment Building in the KP1 Community Park including associated ancillary works and look forward to its completion.

16/02493/FUL: Change of use from vacant land (previously A3 restaurant) to open self-storage facility (B8). Former Megatron Site Ermine Street Alconbury – *received 12 Dec 16*, *extension gained till 11Jan 17*

Recommend approval: Subject to planning conditions being imposed so the developer and the successors must maintain the external appearance of the site and containers may not be stacked higher than 2.

Consultation

To approve PC response to Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: Wind Energy Developments, 21/11/16 to 16/01/17.

Parish Council recommendations: 'The Stukeleys Parish Council recommends 'Option 1: Whole district is identified as suitable' provided that the work developed by HDC in 'Wind Energy Development in Huntingdonshire SPD - June 2014' is incorporated into the Local Plan'.

It was agreed to delegate powers to the Planning Committee to respond to these 3 planning consultations:

- 16/02663/REM Proposal: Application for approval of appearance, layout, landscaping, access and scale in respect of the construction of a business incubator unit comprising 1,710m2 B1 use with highways works, car parking, landscaping, lighting, substation, minor ground remodelling and associated works, Alconbury Weald Ermine Street Little Stukeley. Due back HDC by 12 Jan 17.
- 2. 16/02677/HHFUL Proposal: Proposed kitchen, family room and front entrance extension and change of external finishes to existing dwelling, Stukeley Gardens Owl End Great Stukeley. *Due back HDC by 19 Jan 17.*
- 16/02705/FUL Erection of a two-storey dwelling replacing a former dwelling (new design to replace previously approved scheme) and associated works, Lodge Farm Cottage Low Road Little Stukeley. Due back HDC by 24 Jan 17.

Please note that Parish Council Meetings start with 15 MINUTES OPEN MEETING 7.15pm to 7.30pm. Members of the council are available between 7.15pm and 7.30pm when members of the public can address the Council in an open surgery session. This part cannot be longer than 15 minutes so that the formal meeting is started promptly at 7.30pm. Please see the Agenda for further details.

Alconbury & Brampton Surgeries

Premises We expect our new consulting and treatment rooms at Alconbury to be available in February 2017. Dr Bhimpuria and our HCA Alyssa Lawford will be based in the new rooms and a small waiting area will be available in close proximity for patients waiting to see them. We have had our first patients register from Alconbury Weald and as our list size grows we will be working to ensure we have capacity to sustain our current level of service for all patients.

Pharmacy: You may be aware that the recent application to open a Pharmacy in Alconbury Village was approved. The applicant must now find premises and be open within 6 months and under these circumstances we will no longer be able to continue to dispense to patients resident in Alconbury and Alconbury Weston. As a Practice we unsuccessfully opposed the new Pharmacy as we felt this change would not benefit our patients. We are currently exploring our options in relation to the proposed pharmacy and would like to reassure you that we will do our utmost to ensure a smooth transition of services for our patients.

Team Changes; In February, we have Josie Hammond joining our reception team at both Surgeries and Dr Hattle recently returned from Maternity Leave. Dr Anyanwu is with us until April, Dr Kooverjee remains with us until May and Dr Jiwa will be at the Practice until August 2017. We also have Cambridge University Medical Students with us in February and March. All trainees are supported by our existing GP team to ensure you continue to receive a positive experience at the Surgery.

Albram continues to work hard for the Practice raising monies and we would like to take this opportunity to thank them for recently contributing towards a new ECG machine at Brampton which enables patients to have their heart monitored in surgery without attending Secondary care. Albram have also generously agreed to fund two additional hydraulic couches for our new consulting rooms which will make it easier for patients with limited mobility to be examined in comfort when they consult with their GP.

MR PERNICKETY BANNED FROM STUKELEYS PUB!!!!

Before I begin my latest report on Public Houses I have frequented I have to tell you that my review of, The Stukeleys Country Hotel, (the `Pink Pub`) brought a wholly unexpected and less than savoury response.

That response was that I have been summarily BANNED from the pub!!

Yes I ventured into the pub to be met with the wrath of the Gods in the shape of the landlady who told me that I should not have mentioned the peeling wall, or the colour scheme or indeed give my opinion of her beers and wines and yet that's what I thought a reviewers job was? To tell the truth from a third party perspective and to allow that fresh view to permeate through the incumbents skull to allow them to make any changes they think necessary. I wonder how often AA Gill or Egon Ronay had been banned from restaurants? Nor indeed have I been over the past few years in my reviews of restaurants (some of which have Michelin Star`s) and public houses in Ludlow in Shropshire where I venture on retreat occasionally.

So my friends I cannot bring you any further news of either improvements or further diminishment of this particular pub as I cannot venture on to the premises.

Please email the editor with your reviews of the pub or views on my banning.

What a difference of attitude from the landladies of the `Three Horseshoes` in Great Stukeley. Here I was contacted and told that they had read the review and although it was not one they would have written it was truthful and fair and indeed they had used it to their advantage with a meeting they had with the pub owners area manager. How refreshing that is. Methinks perhaps others should take note.

Mr Pernickety visits: The Addison Arms Glatton Nr Sawtry

A public house has stood on this site in Glatton since early times. A tavern run by the aptly-named Mrs Goodale (!) was demolished at the beginning of the 18th century

to make way for the present building. The pub was named after Joseph Addison (1672-1719), the well-known playwright perhaps best remembered for writing: "A woman seldom asks advice before she has bought her wedding clothes." The building is of considerable architectural interest and is particularly notable for its combination of a 'spine beam', common in 17th century buildings, and the 'cross beam' found in later structures. The spine beam runs through the Lounge into the Bar where the cross beam can also be seen. The exterior shows considerable Dutch influence, especially with its appropriately bottle-shaped gable ends. The bricks are Flemish, almost certainly carried to an East of England port from Holland as ballast. With the passing of time, the original thatched roof has been covered with tiles.

I visited on a Wednesday at 13-00hrs with two clients. The bar was occupied by seven patrons. The pub has an eating area with approximately 50 covers although no one was eating at the time of our arrival. The barmaid was well presented, welcoming and chatty. The Real Ales on offer were `Adnams Broadside`, `Digfield Addison Ale` and `Digfield Fools Nook`. All were tried and all were found to be excellent. The pub also serves the usual run of keg bitters. It was also CAMRA`s Rural Pub of the Year in 2014 and 2015. It definitely will not be in 2016.

There was a change of ownership at the Addison last summer and the difference in service and food variety and quality has unfortunately deteriorated. Before the change every time I visited the pub was packed with both diners and drinkers. Since the change a lot of the food appears to be microwaved and the real ales are no longer rotated. The food we ordered was prompt in its arrival and ok in the amounts served BUT it was bland and unexciting. The menu has also shrunk markedly.

To cap it all the temperature outside was 2 degrees and the heating in the pub was off! True the pub has a wood burner in the bar but that was not well kept being burnt down to a very low level and not being tended but to have no heating in the eating area; a very bad mistake.

To be blunt my clients and I all left with the same opinion; namely it's a shame the pub has gone so far downhill and at such speed. We will not be returning.

My advice? Give it a miss and carry on to `The Greystones` in Sawtry, a free house.
