

THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Extraordinary Stukeleys Parish Council meeting was on Mon 8 January 2018 at 7.15pm at LSVH.

Parish Council discussed these Planning Consultations and made Planning Recommendations to HDC:

Proposal: Retrospective garage/workshop to side of property,

Site Address: 24 Low Road Little Stukeley Huntingdon, Reference: 17/02531/HHFUL

Approve: Well-constructed building which enhances the site.

Proposal: The erection of 3 x 4-bedroom dwellings,

Site Address: Land Opposite 91 Ermine Street Little Stukeley,

Reference: 17/02513/FUL 1 resident objection received.

Recommend refusal because: Little Stukeley is identified as an 'infill village' in the Huntingdonshire Local Plan and further identified as a 'small settlement' in the draft local plan. The proposed development is outside of the village environmental limits and none of the conditions apply that would qualify this site for countryside development. Additionally, the proposed development is part of the area considered to be important buffer between Little Stukeley and Alconbury Weald.

Proposal: Proposed extensions and alterations of existing bungalow to form 1.5 storey detached dwelling together with new detached double garage,

Site Address: 19 Low Road Little Stukeley Huntingdon,

Reference: 17/02663/HHFUL

1 resident objection to the garage received.

Refusing on the grounds of the loss of the light due to the siting of the garage.

Parish Council also considered the funding to Village Halls and agreed to provide up to £35,000 to each Village Hall from CIL money.

Regarding the Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: Proposed Submission available to view and comment between 18/12/17 09:00 to 05/02/18 17:00. Cllr S Burton agreed to draft a response on the PC behalf and circulate the document for further PC comments before the submission to HDC.

PLEASE NOTE that 2 casual vacancies have arisen in the Office of Councillor for the Parish Council.

In accordance with Section 89(3) of the Local Government Act 1972, where the vacancy occurs within six months before the day on which the councillor whose office is vacant would regularly have retired, an election shall not be held under Section 89(1) of the above Act, and the vacancy will be filled at the next ordinary election of councillors on 3 May 2018.

The Council may choose to fill the vacancy for the period until that election.


THURSFORD GROUP CHARITY DONATION 2017

MUST VISIT: THE PEOPLE'S POST Tuesday 15th May 2018

Deep under the streets of the Capital a disused railway tunnel stretches for SIX MILES. After being shut for a decade there are now plans to reopen the LONDON POST OFFICE RAILWAY-known as MAIL RAIL.

On Tuesday 15th May 2018 you will have the good fortune to join us on a new and exciting day trip-THE PEOPLE'S POST.

In a central London railway depot, it feels as though MAIL RAIL'S workers suddenly upped and left and time stood still. Hefty 1920's giant levered mechanical equipment sits incongruously next to 1980's jumbo walkie-talkies while industrial pipes and strips of peeling paint hang from the ceiling. Loose cables wind up the walls alongside a 1989 safety poster while a 1959 Ordnance Survey map of Holborn sits rolled up on a desk.

MAIL RAIL was approved by an Act of Parliament a century ago and during its heyday driverless trains carried TWELVE (12) MILLION POSTAL ITEMS DAILY on the line stretching from Whitechapel in the East End to West London's Paddington. But it was mothballed a decade ago.

On the day of our special visit to RAIL MAIL you have the option of descending in a lift to the Mount Pleasant platform. You enter what feels like a normal Tube platform but the tunnels at each end are smaller reducing to 7 feet(2.1m) in diameter. A tiny train sits on the track, one of 70 stored on the network. This train has been specially adapted with seats for twelve passengers. If you would prefer, you can see the train and its journey on CCTV from MAIL RAILS' control room.

On Tuesday 15th May 2018 we will meet at the Great Stukeley Village Hall for a PROMPT 08.30am departure to meet with our *Blue Badge Holder Guide* in time for morning refreshments (not included in the cover price) at 10.30am.
