#### The Stukeleys Parish – Neighbourhood Plan

Some readers may recall that an initial consultation was held to identify issues facing the Parish to support preparing a Neighbourhood Plan.

Andie Hallihan (a recently co-opted councillor) has volunteered to help restart the process and lead the development of the Neighbourhood Plan. He has been informed (and warned!) of the earlier work to develop a Plan.

Andie is keen to hear from anyone willing to be involved with the Neighbourhood Plan. In particular, he is hoping to hear from everyone who gave their time and thought into the earlier work.

The Neighbourhood Plan is a community-led planning framework for guiding the future development of the Parish. It may cover a wide range of social, economic and environmental issues including housing, employment, heritage and transport. It can guide the provision of infrastructure such as paths, open space and future highways works.

When finished the Neighbourhood Plan becomes part of the statutory development plan for the Parish after completing an independent examination (to ensure it meets legal requirements) and passing a public referendum. It gives the local community more influence and control over the development of their area.

We need a group or forum to help engage the wider community to identify the range of wants and needs in the Parish. In addition, the Parish Council will commission professional help to support preparing the Plan.

Please contact Andie if you are interested in joining or supporting the forum. We will need to understand the existing and proposed planning policies, collaborate (and compromise) with a diverse range of parishioners and other stakeholders, and analyse and prepare reports and documents to meet legal requirements.

The Plan is likely to take 18-24 months (or longer). The process may be confusing and frustrating, but the end result will be thoroughly worth it.

#### The Stukeleys Heritage Group

Disappointingly, only 10 people turned up for our Heritage Quiz Night on 16th January, but they organised themselves into two teams and with much goodnatured competitiveness battled it out. It was a close-run thing with both teams scoring 50 points after five rounds and it took two tie-breakers to decide the winner. My thanks to those who came.

#### NEW: A Visit to the Royal Botanical Gardens, KEW Tuesday 21st May 2019

On *Tuesday 21st May 2019* I am organizing a super visit to KEW GARDENS founded in 1759, and a *UNESCO World Heritage Site* since 2003, which I hope will interest you.

We will be departing from the Great Stukeley Village Hall at 8am, giving us plenty of time to arrive as near to 10.30am bearing in mind that we will be making this journey during the morning rush hours.

Included in the cover price of £46.50 per person is your entrance fee, Morning Refreshments, your coach journey to and from London, and a ticket on the hop on/hop off *Kew Explorer* tram.

The Kew Explorer ,two trams each with seventy five places, operate every half hour from the Victoria Gate starting at 11am. This is the "perfect way" of visiting all corners of Kews' 330 acres of gardens, botanical glasshouses, four Grade I listed buildings,36 Grade II listed structures,11 plant houses- ranging from Alpine to Bonsai and Palm to Waterlilly-,10 ornamental buildings including the famous Pagoda(1762) and Queen Charlotte's Cottage(1771) and four Galleries and Museums. I have specially added this service to our programme to make your visit much more comfortable as this will allow you to save your strength and help those with mobility problems to take in the extremities of the garden and its most beautiful views across to Syon House over the River Thames. The Kew Explorer's take a circular route and the drivers provide a commentary.

For the more intrepid there is the *Treetop Walkway*, opened in 2008, which takes visitors on a 200-meter-long walk 18 meters high in the tree canopy of a woodland glade. The Walkway has lifts and stairs to enable all to benefit from the experience.






