Report of the December Stukeleys Parish Council Meeting

Eight councillors, the District & County Councillors attended the December meeting of the Council.

It was unfortunately reported that our prospective new clerk, although originally provisionally accepting the post had eventually decided that the expected workload could be too great, this means that the process will have to commence again, I have agreed in these difficult circumstances to remain in office until such time as a suitable candidate is confirmed to take my place.

The Council confirmed its commitment to safeguard the villages' identity by registering their objections to certain land development proposals within the HDC environmental capacity study.

Although the fencing work was now complete, there were still some instances of rabbit incursions in some areas of the Playing field, it was agreed to monitor the situation until next spring to establish whether further protection measures may have to be considered.

The long term future of the area was another issue that concerned several members and as to whether landscaping, extra furniture and facilities should be considered, even controlled dog walking, this last item however would require by law that the specific children's play area would need security fencing on its boundaries, it was agreed that members should seriously consider the options over the next few months, with the matter being an agenda item for discussion at the Council April meeting. It was notified that the planned installation of a bollard at the junction of Owl End and Bridleway 10 should be advertised extensively with the view of implementation early in

Mrs. Smith had already done sterling work on the provision of a bus shelter for Little Stukeley, the cost of which could vary between £2000-£8000, she intimated that she had received an offer from a resident of a donation but was still seeking other grant sources, she added there was a slight possibility of a 'demo' unit shelter being available but that it required dismantling and then re-erection on site.

the New Year.

It was reported that a voluntary group of young persons from the American enclave at RAF Alconbury were going to carry out a litter pick and general tidy up of our 'green spaces' on 15th December.

Mr. Hulstrom was still investigating the large number of light van and commercial movements in Green End and also the perception of excessive speed of these vehicles. It was reported that HDC planning department were to make a recommendation on the Alconbury Weald application on 9th December, but as the Parish Council still had some reservations on the delivery of mitigating measures to benefit the villages, Mr. Ryan was to address the panel before the meeting made a decision.

A response from the District Council clearly indicated that they were the owners of the West View green space and that this included the gravel track servicing three properties in that area, they stated categorically that they only, as the owning authority had any jurisdiction in the matter of prohibiting use of the track, the various properties were to be copied into this correspondence for information purposes.

The Precept, that is the amount of money required for Parish Council spending for the period 2014/15 was set at £25850.

St. EDWARD'S CROWN is solid gold, studded with more than 400 precious and semi-precious stones with a purple velvet cap ringed in ermine. This is one of THE most spectacular pieces in the CROWN JEWELS collection.





WISER Recycling will collect from right outside your house! All items will be taken to our fully licensed treatment facility in St Ives for Reuse, Refurbishment or Recycling.

WISER has partnerships with many local and regional charities including Emmaus, Lighthouse, i-Trust and Eco-Computer Systems through which it sells working items back to social groups and low income families. 


