





THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council met on 5 Dec 16 at Little Stukeley Village Hall and the next scheduled meeting is on Mon 6 Feb 17 at Great Stukeley Village Hall. Please note that Council does not meet in January but please check the website and Notice Boards for the extraordinary meetings. Parish Council Meetings start with 15 MINUTE OPEN MEETING 7.15pm to 7.30pm when members of the public can address the Council. This part cannot be longer than 15 minutes so that the formal meeting is started promptly at 7.30pm. Please see the Agenda for further details. Budget and precept for 2017/18 were approved at Dec Parish Council Meeting and Precept request is already submitted Huntingdonshire District Council. No new planning applications received up to 30 Nov 16.

One Planning consultation received after the Agenda was issued: 16/029494/HHFUL 18 Chestnut Grove Great Stukeley PE28 4AT Single storey rear extension. It was agreed to delegate powers to Planning Committee to respond to this Planning Consultation only.

Clerk received a phone call from HDC case officer Gavin Sylvester re: 16/01851/REM that Urban & Civic amended the proposals for the community park and HDC would like to consult PC on the amendments: 'Construction of new Community Park, to include; allotments, MUGA, NEAP, skate park, amenity open space, landscaping, carparking (revised drawings').

The main change is a reduction in car parking spaces to serve the park. PC previously approved the application. Drawings showing the revisions to the above proposal were circulated to full council. The main change is a reduction in car parking spaces from 30 to 22, albeit there is potential to expand the car park in the future, the applicant says. Other changes include the addition of a grass maze and alterations to pathways.

As Alconbury Weald was on the Agenda for Dec Parish Council meeting PC members discussed the amended proposals and agreed to approve them.

A consultation received re: Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: Wind Energy Developments, 21/11/16 to 16/01/17. Parish Council Members viewed the plans prior to the meeting and now working on the Parish Council response to HDC.

Rebecca Britton, Urban & Civic gave a presentation on Alconbury Weald: Proposed diversion and upgrade of FP11 across Grange Farm and planned works for the implementation of the foul water connection - which goes along the edge of the site north of the 2 villages.

Parish Council discussed the Electoral Review of Huntingdonshire: Final Recommendations. A full copy of the report is available on the website, www.lgbce.org.uk. An interactive map of final recommendations is available at www.consultation.lgbce.org.uk. The Stukeleys Parish boundaries will remain as they are, but the HDC Ward will include Stukeley Meadows, which was confirmed by HDC Cllr Keith Barker.

Interim Review of Polling Districts, Polling places and Polling Stations, consultation (consultation ends 6 Jan 17). The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has completed its review of electoral arrangements for Cambridgeshire County Council in September 2016 and

Huntingdonshire District Council in November 2016. As a result, HDC needs to carry out a review of some of its polling districts and polling arrangements in order to run elections for the new Divisions and Wards from May 2017.

As stated by HDC: A new polling district for Alconbury Weald be created to allow residents there to vote in their own local polling station. The polling place will be defined as the polling district of Alconbury Weald. The arrangements will be kept under review as the area continues to grow. CHANGES AT ALCONBURY WEALD/THE STUKELEYS – REASON FOR REVIEW Development at the Alconbury Weald is sited within the parish of The Stukeleys, encompassing Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley. Currently although there are no electors present it is predicted that by 31st March 2018 an estimated 250 properties will have been completed. Any electors who will be resident there will have to visit the Little Stukeley polling station in order to cast their vote. As Alconbury Weald is detached from the village of Little Stukeley it would not make it easy for the electors to vote there. It may be necessary to undertake a Community Governance Review (CGR) in the future to decide on future governance arrangements for the Alconbury Weald area and whether the area should become its own parish with designated boundaries. Irrespective of whether Alconbury Weald becomes its own parish or not, it will need to be adopted as a polling district now in order to allow electors to visit a polling station that is local to them.

RECOMMENDATION A new polling district of Alconbury Weald should be created. This polling district will be renamed should the area become parished and a future review will amend polling district boundaries if these are affected adversely by the CGR. Parish Council Members noted the Consultation.

The Stukeleys Parish Neighbourhood Plan

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

No one knows more about our community and how changes impact it than we do, the parishioners of The Stukeleys. Since 2011, the law (Localism Act 2011) has recognised that and gives us the power to develop a plan, a shared vision, for our neighbourhood that has the same weight in law as the Local Plan developed by Huntingdon District Council (HDC).

When planning officers consider planning applications, they will use our Neighbourhood Plan to assist in forming their recommendations and when HDC makes planning decisions, they will give the same regard to our Neighbourhood Plan as they do to the Local Plan and any other material consideration.

The Neighbourhood Plan is our opportunity to help shape the future of our Parish and gives us the weight of law behind our views.

There is also a direct financial benefit to our community from the implementation of a local plan. Each year, HDC pays out Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money to Parish and Town Councils. This year, the first time CIL money has been paid to The Stukeleys, we received just over £18,000 as our proportion of CIL, all of which came from development at Alconbury Weald. Our share of CIL money levied in our parish is currently 15% and capped based on the number of electors in our parish, but with a Neighbourhood Plan in place, our share increases to 25% with no cap. If we already had a plan in place, our share of CIL money this year would have been around £30,000 rather than the £18,000 we received — a substantial difference for our community.

Sounds good! How are we doing?

On 7 April 2016, The Stukeleys Parish Council wrote to HDC to give notice of our intention to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan that will cover the whole of our parish. You can see a copy of that letter and a copy of the map referred to in the letter on the parish council website — http://thestukeleys-pc.gov.uk/neighbourhood_plan.php.

On 2 June 2016, HDC confirmed approval of our application to have the entire parish designated for the Neighbourhood Plan. A copy of the officer's report recommending approval can also be found on the website.

OK! Now what?

In July, the Parish Council created a Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group and agreed Terms of Reference for that group. A total of ten parishioners are part of the steering group with five of those parishioners also being parish councillors (a list of the group members can also be found on the website). The steering group has two stated purposes:

- 1. To oversee the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan so that it will progress through the Independent Examination and the community referendum that are required by law before it can be 'made' and become statutory planning policy.
- 2. To prepare a report for the Parish Council that contains a detailed list of all of the additional facilities, improvements and changes that are identified during the preparation of the Plan, but that can't be included because they fall outside of planning policy.

The steering group has committed itself to consult widely within our community and gather evidence to support the recommendations and decisions made by the steering group. The first actions for that group, which is now meeting regularly, are to put together a project timeline and create a budget forecast. Once that forecast is prepared, we are able to approach HDC for funding for the process of developing our Neighbourhood Plan.

A meeting scheduled with HDC for 14 December will have taken place by the time you read this and the next update will pass on what happened at that meeting.

Further meetings are planned with Urban & Civic – by far the developer with the biggest influence on our community – and with planning consultants who may be able to assist in the development of our plan. We'll provide an update on those meetings, too.

How can I help?

Discussions with communities that are already working on Neighbourhood Plans and those that have completed them, show that there is an enormous amount of work to be done consulting with the community and other stakeholders, including landowners, businesses, and schools, reporting on those consultations and preparing the plan. In an ideal world, every person with an interest in our Neighbourhood Plan would have the opportunity and the desire to take part in the consultation and have their voice heard. In reality, only a small percentage of people take part in consultations.

As the work develops, we will distribute further information about the Neighbourhood Plan, hold public meetings to discuss what gets included in the plan, request feedback on proposed content and encourage contributions, discussion, and debate. This is your community and we encourage <u>YOU</u> to take part in those activities. Mr Pernickety visits: The Three Horseshoes Great Stukeley

This pub is a monolith to the great 'Watneys Red' style of pub building from the mid/ late 1960's. I understand that a 16C pub was flattened to make way for it. Vandalism in the extreme!

The pub clearly needs a great deal of work to bring it up to today's standards and I understand that works have been applied for but due to the complex ownership of the pub these works have been in limbo for several years. The fabric of the pub shows this only too well. The present manager of the pub, Victoria, has fought valiantly to get the works undertaken but a "could not give a damn" mentality by the lease holder has meant that she has not been able to bring forward the improvements needed. Even basic matters such as the outside lights which do not work and a roof in the back bar which leaks so badly it is out of use have not been taken care of. Shameful!

However the pub itself still had a lively atmosphere when I visited one Wednesday at 18-00hrs. The bar had around a dozen clientele at the time ranging right across the socio-economic spectrum. The beers on offer were a couple of good lagers, a bitter and a selection of good quality bottled ales at good prices. The landlady informed me that she would love to offer a good real ale but cannot do so as again promised improvements to the cellar by the lease holder had not come to fruition. It was the same story with the kitchen. As the pub cannot offer food the landlady welcomes `take away`s` to be delivered to the pub and provides the necessary cutlery, etc., at nil charge. A sensible compromise. Even with the drawbacks as noted above the bar was lively as was the banter going on. It is obviously a very welcoming pub. I passed a very pleasant 90 minutes and drank several bottled beers.

I hope for, not only for Victories sake, but also the villages sake, that the present leaseholder comes to his senses and improves the pub otherwise the Stukeleys will be in the position of having a single pub which is not a good situation. "Use it or lose it" once again comes to mind!

Mr Pernickety Visits: The Sandford House, George St, Huntingdon

This pub has recently been fashioned out of two empty buildings by the JD Weatherspoon Chain. It was last used as a post office and an antiques mall with several owners. The Grade II listed building was once a large home belonging to coach builder Charles Sandford Wendover, hence `Sandford House`. The adjacent factory made carriages for Royalty and then custom-built car bodies, including 800 for Rolls Royce. There is a lot of history shown on the walls and the architecture of the building is evident where it has been left to `breath` and not been obscured with modern `refinements`.

Upon my arrival last week it was noted that the establishment was bursting at the seams. It was lively in atmosphere although its mainly open plan barn like appearance may not appeal to all. There are a few tables in the quieter upper floor area although these account for less than 15% of its available covers. It also has outside tables at the front and rear of the premises. The staff I encountered were both knowledgeable about the drinks and food and were polite and welcoming. The staff had kept the pub clean and tidy.

The clientele at 13-00hrs was predominantly over the age of forty but with a very mixed socio-economic back ground. Interestingly I would hazard a guess and say less than 20% of the clientele were just drinking with the vast majority eating.

There was a choice of 15 cask ales, 5 lagers, 4 ciders and many, many more in bottles and cans. The range of spirits and wines was also long and varied. The three cask ales sampled were excellent being kept in superb condition and at a price that could not be beaten locally. The food sampled was the curry of the day that was on offer as a special plus my companion had a chicken dish with an Italian twist. Both were of very good quality, hot and presented well and under £5! (Bear this in mind when you see the food score below, it's on a value for money as well as quality scale).

Would I visit the Sandford again? Yes but it's not a place to visit for a long nights drinking nor one where you would go for a romantic liaison. But it's functional and for lunch or perhaps an early doors starter for an evening it's brilliant value.




