

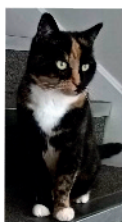

STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Stukeleys Parish Council meeting was on Mon 4 December 17 at 7.15pm at LSVH.

Parish Council discussed these Planning Consultations and made Planning Recommendations to HDC:

1) Proposal: Extension to dwelling. 18 Montagu Road, Great Stukeley, PE28 4AS, Reference: 17/02227/HHFUL

Recommend approval: Improves the street scene.

2) Proposal: Erection of an oak framed garden room. Site Address: 21 Church Road Great Stukeley Huntingdon, Reference: 17/02355/HHFUL

Recommend Approval: No adverse impact.

3) Proposal: Proposed development for 3 dwellings, Site Address: Land South West Of November Cottage Green End Great Stukeley, Reference: 17/02261/FUL, received 20 Nov 17. PC received 2 objections in writing to the above application.

Recommend Refusal: Because of the overdevelopment of the site and the detrimental effect to the surrounding area.

Please note there is one Vacancy for a Parish Councillor.

Steph Burton, U&C attended the Council meeting and the update on Ermine Street Environmental Enhancements was provided.

The Budget and Precept for 2018/19 was approved and submitted HDC.

GSVH applied for CIL funding for the Village hall refurbishment works. LSVH will be applying too at the extraordinary PC meeting on Mon 8 Jan 18 at LSVH. CIL money was agreed by PC to be used towards these projects.

Mr Pernickety visits the `Marsh Harrier` St Ives (and wishes he had not)

I had delayed visiting this pub as it was new and it's fair to leave a new pub until it has had a chance settle down, in this case for over a year. Myself and my companions, (yes, I have more than one!) visited on a Saturday night at 19-00hrs.

It's a large restaurant pub with the typical pseudo look of trying to be quaint and old worldly on the outside but modern on the inside. It did not succeed for me either way. It was actually bland and you could have been anywhere in the UK once you entered. It has a varied menu and eight (8) real ale pumps on the bar with various keg beers and wines on offer. Great play is made in the marketing in regard to the pub having `Real Ale` on tap.

Now from eight real ale pumps you would expect possibly eight different real ales? Er no not here; there were two on offer, Marston's Pedigree and Wainwrights bitter, with four pumps for each!! Also, it was made very plain to us that the bar was not for sitting at, standing at or indeed ordering through!! In other words, it was for show. It was intimated to us to sit or leave. We Sat. I had the Pedigree which started the night as a good drink but four pints later it was flat and with no body. Switching to the Wainwrights' found a lacklustre beer of no discernible quality.

As we had to sit we looked at the menu and found it not cheap (Chili or Chicken Pie £14 or £11 for a burger plus sides at up to £5 each). We opted for the Christmas menu at £15 per head which consisted of an `industrialised` Pate, Roast Turkey with trimmings and `cold vegetables` and a Pana Cotta which had the consistency of `cheesecake`. When the manager was told of the state of the vegetables she just shrugged it off and walked away. In addition, we had the "pleasure" of around six children aged around eight or nine running around the place like banshees on heat for at least an hour, not conducive to a great atmosphere and a total absence of control by either the parents or the staff. Again, a shrug was given by management and we were told "it's a family pub, what do you expect". I cannot put into print what I expected to happen or I said at that point! The last straw was when asking if they had a range of malt whiskies the answer was "Yes many". I asked for a "Lowland Malt". I was served `Jim Bean` and then argued with as to its origin. Its American, not from Lowland Scotland!

THE BRICK LANE MUSIC HALL - ALADDIN...for Grown-ups ONLY! Wednesday 21st February 2018

WOW! It's *Pantomime* time at the Brick Lane Music Hall on Wednesday 21st February 2018 when my excited group of SIXTEEN (16) will be attending *ALADDIN!* This show is for ADULT Boys and Girls. It really is a naughty show offered by Vincent Hayes the founder of The Brick Lane Music Hall.

Pantomime has been part of the British heritage and tradition for almost 170 years. Of all forms of theatrical entertainment enjoyed by the Victorians it is the sole survivor apart from Music Hall which plays at Brick Lane. Italy and France played a big part in *Pantomime* in the 18th Century. Continental players appeared in England with their Italian Night Scenes and the *Commedia dell' Arte* performances. The British enjoyed them immensely as they did the *Harlequinade* shows with Harlequin, Pantaloon, Clown Columbine - and the only survivor to this day-Punchinello. Now it is our seaside chum *Mr. Punch* along with his wife Judy, the baby, the crocodile, the policeman and the sausages!

On the day of our visit we will assemble at the Great Stukeley Village Hall at 10.45am for a PROMPT 11.00am departure.

Our visit includes *Aladdin*, the *Pantomime* our journey to London returning to Great Stukeley, a delicious three-course lunch and a tip for our driver. All this for just £69.00 per person. Great value for money.

MUST VISIT: ALLERTON CASTLE

Tuesday 24th April 2018

ALLERTON CASTLE is THE grandest and most elegant Gothic Revival stately home in England. Grade 1 English Heritage listed, the CASTLE is steeped in English history.

ALLERTON CASTLE was the ancestral home of Lords Mobray (created in 1283), Seagrave (created in 1295) and Stourton, the Premier Baron of England (created in 1448). In the eighteenth century the property was owned by Prince Frederick, the Duke of York, brother the King George IV.

Visit with us the Great Hall which exudes Gothic splendor with its extraordinary 70-foot-high hammer beam ceiling with richly carved oak paneling. The Library is richly decorated in warm reds and blues and the Ballroom has an ornate vaulted ceiling.

In 2004 restoration was almost completed. Sadly, in January 2005 one third of the CASTLE was destroyed by an immense fire. This included the Dining Room, the Venetian Bed Chamber and the State Rooms. The Library and Conservatory were also severely damaged by the fire. However, this beautiful Castle has now been completely renovated and is awaiting our visit on Tuesday 24th April 2018-just days after they reopen for the 2018 season.

We will be gathering at The Great Stukeley, Village Hall at 08.45am for a PROMPT 09.00am departure. Included in the cover price of just £49.90 per person is a SHERRY RECEPTION on our arrival and a DELICIOUS AFTERNOON TEA, served in their elegant Ballroom, the coach to and from Yorkshire and a tip for our driver.
