# The Stukeleys Parish Council News

The Parish Meeting was held on the 6th June 2016 at Great Stukeley Village Hall.

A resident expressed concern that the a bus shelter for Little Stukeley had still not been provided; Cllr Sally Smith explained that the shelter would be provided when the Ermine Street Enhancement Works had been completed to ensure the bus shelter was corrected positioned. It was also noted that the grass had not been strimmed in Little Stukeley.

The village seats to be repainted and the Little Stukeley village sign flower bed to be replanted.

The following planning applications were considered by the Parish Council:

- i 44 Low Road, Little Stukeley 16/00844/HHFUL Enlarge existing garage to include one additional parking bay to side and a workshop to the rear. It was resolved to recommend approval as the application raised no material planning concerns.
- ii Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street, Little Stukeley 16/01066/REM Application for approval of appearance, layout, landscaping, access and scale (outside a Key Phase) in respect of the construction of 43,846.5 m2 mixed B1(a), B1(b), B2 and ancillary B8 floorspace and associated highway, drainage, landscaping, ground remodelling and ancillary works. It was resolved to recommend approval as the application was consistent with its planning permission and raised no material planning concerns.
- iii Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street, Little Stukeley 16/01047/REM –

  Application for approval of appearance, layout, landscaping, access and scale in respect of the construction of new highways including associated highways landscaping and ancillary works. It was resolved to recommend approval as the application was consistent with its planning permission and raised no material planning concerns.

In the 1k Fun Run, Gaige Duffy came first and Sean Flanagan was second in the male category. Madison Ball and Freya Harris were first and second females.




