

STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Stukeleys Parish Council met on Monday 5 Jun 2017 at Great Stukeley Village Hall. Please check the Parish Council's website and Notice Boards for the Minutes.

Parish Council welcomed a new Parish Councillor Mr Tim Close who joined the Council on 5 Jun 17. Due to a resignation of a Councillor Stef van den Haak there is a new Vacancy on the Parish Council now. A bye-election to fill the vacancy will be held within 14 days (not counting Saturdays and Sundays) from 9 Jun 17 if ten electors for the ward/parish give notice in writing claiming such an election to the Returning Officer. If no such notice is given the Parish Council will fill the vacancy by co-option. Now we are waiting to hear from Huntingdonshire District Council.

New Planning Application:

17/00803/FUL New Dwelling, 11 Pringle Way Little Stukeley Huntingdon PE28 4BH 1 letter of objection was received.

It was decided by Parish Council to Recommend Refusal this planning consultation: Due to detrimental effect to the street scene and overbearing to 2 listed buildings.

Annual Return for 2016/17 Financial year is now posted to External Auditors.

Jennifer Thomas Consultancy Ltd wrote to The Stukeley's Parish Council re: Neighbourhood Plan: Agreserves Land, a hard copy of the letter and plans was received. It was agreed to invite Jennifer Thomas Consultancy Ltd to the next Parish Council meeting in July. Jennifer Thomas Consultancy Ltd confirmed their attendance.

Annual Parish Meeting was held on Mon 22 May 2017 where residents of The Stukeleys Parish raised various matters of concern relating to their local community and various Village Representatives as well as Voluntary Organizations in the Parish presented their reports. Thank you everyone.

Please note there are vacant plots at The Stukeleys Allotment gardens. Please let the Clerk or Chairman of the Allotment Association, David Silsby, (<u>d.j.silsby@hotmail.co.uk</u>) know if you would like to rent one!

Councillors T Pinner and S Parkin together with the Clerk attended Joint Parishes Meeting on Thu 8 Jun 17 where various issues were discussed with Urban & Civic: Housing (Around 100 houses are planned to be built on site by the end of this year); Community park (includes MUGA, Skatepark (opening Jun 17), allotments, play area, community shop (opening end of June/beginning of July, opening hours are 7.30am to 1pm Mon to Fri and 8am to 12.30pm Sat, depends on the demand of course), Clay Lane – potential bus, bicycle, pedestrians access which is ongoing; Footpath 11 issues; Traffic Calming works which are delayed due to changes to the scheme. Urban & Civic are looking at confirming the work schedule and starting to book road time. Urban & Civic have meetings set with HDC and CCC.



Reflections: THIS COUNTRY CALLED ENGLAND - Thursday 18th May 2017





There has been a church in Great Stukeley, in some form, since 1086 and the earliest part of St Bartholomew's church dates from 1250. Over the centuries there have been various additions and modifications as the congregation grew. Sadly the typical Sunday congregation in 2017 would fit into the smallest of the church's 3 chapels. The church is now full only at Christmas. However, the small congregation has to carry the expense of keeping the church open for weekly services, baptisms, weddings and funerals, which are for the benefit of the whole village. The collections have to cover the bills (electricity, water and Insurance) and an annual Church Ministry share payable to Ely diocese, currently £10500. The monthly income is £600, and the outgoings £1200. We do NOT receive ANY funding from Ely or the Church Commissioners. You don't need a business degree to know that the church and services in the current form are not sustainable without a large increase in income.

In June 2016 thieves stole the lead from the North aisle of the church. To date, the Church PCC have raised £15K of the £30K necessary before an application for Lottery funding to replace the roof and carry out other essential building works, can be made. We have a small group of regular supporters who attend every Lenten lunch, Harvest Lunch, Beetle Drive and other fund raising activities and we are eternally grateful to them. But we need more! If you would like to make a donation to keep our church going and to help with the necessary works to maintain the fabric of the building, we do have a monthly, annual or "one off" Gift Aid scheme. If you are willing to volunteer to run a fund raising activity, please speak to a member of the PCC.


