





STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Stukeleys Parish Council met on Monday 8 May 2017 at Little Stukeley Village Hall. Please check the Parish Council's website and Notice Boards for the Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 8 May 2017.

As every year during the Annual Parish Council Meeting in May there is an Election of the chairman. Chairman Karl Gasson resigned and now we have a new Chairman, Terry Pinner. Thank you were expressed to Councillor Karl Gasson for being a chairman and for all the input Cllr Kar Gasson had over this period to both parishes.

Due to resignation of Councillor Michael Womersley-Carter there is one Vacancy of the Parish Council now. A bye-election to fill the vacancy will be held within 14 days (not counting Saturdays and Sundays) from 3 May 2017 if ten electors for the ward/parish give notice in writing claiming such an election to the Returning Officer. If no such notice is given the Parish Council will fill the vacancy by co-option.

Annual Parish Meeting was agreed to be held on Mon 22 May 2017.



Spotted Flycatchers Do you have this increasingly rare bird breeding in your garden? Participate in our survey!

Last year many Cambridgeshire community and parish newsletters, magazines and websites helped with a county-wide survey of Spotted Flycatchers. These are attractive little migrant birds which are summer visitors to village gardens and churchyards. Although they breed with us, they spend ten months of the year travelling between here and their wintering grounds in Southern Africa. This is an increasingly dangerous journey for them, and sadly they are in deep decline. Widespread losses amounted to a 50% decline during 1995-2010, continuing an 90% decline since 1970.

Only some fifty pairs remain breeding in Cambridgeshire, so it's now quite a rare bird, but most rural villages still have a pair or two. The Cambridgeshire Bird Club is again running a survey this year to find and monitor nesting pairs, and it's almost certain that there will be additional pairs in our villages of which we are not aware.

Do you have flycatchers in your garden? Please let the Bird Club know.

THURSFORD'S CHRISTMAS SPECTACULAR 2017 Sunday 19th November 2017

The musical arrangements for THURSFORD'S CHRISTMAS SPECTACULAR 2017 are needed by the third week in June to allow the musical director and the choreographer to begin their programme.

The THURFORD CHRISTMAS STORY began with John Cushing's father George, a Norfolk businessman, who left school at the age of twelve to become a farmhand and was a steamroller driver by sixteen. Steam engines and fairground rides were the passion of his life and George spent decades collecting and restoring them. In the 1930's he bought the farm where he had worked as a boy and housed his machines in the vast black barn which today, hosts the CHRISTMAS SPECTACULAR.

When John, now 77, joined the family business 40 years ago he organized a one-off Carol Concert in the barn surrounded by the steam engines, as an eccentric back drop, to raise money to support the collection. John is a self-taught show producer. Although he did panto at Gresham school, he had no musical training and went straight into his father's laundry business. From this humble beginning THURSFORD'S CHRISTMAS SPECTACULAR evolved into the largest CHRISTMAS show in Europe attracting people from all over the United Kingdom.

The entire structure is 135 meters (443 feet) high and the wheel has an incredible diameter of 120 meters (394 feet). It is the TALLEST ferris wheel in Europe and THE most popular tourist attraction in the United Kingdom visited by well over three and a half million people each year. When erected in 1994 it was the tallest ferris wheel in the world and is still described as the world's tallest cantilevered observation wheel. Unlike the wheels in Singapore and Nachang it is supported by an A-frame on one side only. After our cruise we will be flying high on the London Eye for thirty minutes as part of our exciting London Christmas adventure.

This incredible Christmas celebration day in London is just £48.50 per person. 
