

THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Annual Stukeleys Parish Council meeting was on Mon 14 May 2018 at 7.15pm at Ermine Street Church Academy.

Parish Council discussed these Planning Consultations and made Planning Recommendations to HDC:

1. CCC: H/5005/18/CW Temporary change of use of buildings 4002 and 4003 and adjacent land to form an advanced biofuel demonstration and production centre (Sui Generis) for the processing of waste coffee grounds, including installation of plant and machinery, temporary buildings, ancillary storage and associated works, Building 4002 and 4003, Alconbury Airfield, Alconbury Weald, PE28 4WX, received on 18 Apr 18

This consultation is now closed. No PC comments submitted.

2. Proposal: New dwelling, Site Address: 32 Green End Great Stukeley Huntingdon, Reference: 18/00678/FUL – extension granted till 15 May 18

Three residents' comments/objections received.

PC agreed to recommend refusal: Because of the density of the site being inappropriate.

3. Proposal: Alterations and refurbishment of listed building. Refurbishment, partial demolition and conversion of curtilage listed stable (Barn C) to holiday lets (C3 use). Demolition of modern timber stables (Barns A and D) and replacement with holiday lets Barn H (C3 use), demolition of open Barn F, Site Address: Pringle Farm Pringle Way Little Stukeley, Reference: 18/00720/LBC and 18/00719/FUL

Recommend approval: The same reasons apply as stated before - Because of the enhancement to the site.

4. Proposal: Demolition of motel, services and petrol filling station and change of use from lorry park, motel, services and petrol filling station, to lorry park, incorporating container storage (within the existing lorry park) and erection of office building with associated car parking and replacement lighting Site Address: Alconbury Services Rusts Lane Alconbury. Reference: 18/00707/FUL

No PC comments to be submitted.

5. Proposal: The erection of 3 x 4-bedroom dwellings, Site Address: Land Opposite 91 Ermine Street Little Stukeley, Reference: 17/02513/FUL – revised site plan received on 4 May 18 PC refused previously. Outside of the village boundary.

Recommend Refusal: Because Little Stukeley is identified as an 'infill village' in the Huntingdonshire Local Plan and further identified as a 'small settlement' in the draft local plan. The proposed development is outside of the village environmental limits and none of the conditions apply that would qualify this site for countryside development. Additionally, the proposed development is part of the area considered to be important buffer between Little Stukeley and Alconbury Weald.

Appeal: to 15/00749/FUL Top Farm Ermine Street Alconbury Huntingdon PE28 4EW, Change of use from parking and maintenance of 2 HGV lorries and 2 Trailers and a pickup truck to a mixed use of parking and maintenance of 2 HGV lorries and 2 Trailers and a pick up truck and the storage and sale of aggregates. Including the construction of new aggregate storage bays. Appeal in progress. Noted by PC.

The Stukeleys Parish Council had 5 elected Councillors (PC had uncontested election) and 2 more Councillors were co-opted on Mon 14 May 18 at the Annual Parish Council meeting. Parish Council welcomed Robert Hulstrom and Paula Tuck. Please see the Parish Councillors list for further information.

GDPR is coming into effect from 25 May 2018 and requires Parish Council to meet the regulations with regard to the personal data Parish Council maintain. We have recently learnt that we are likely, depending on a vote in Parliament, not to need to appoint a data protection officer, which is good news. However, it would seem that other parts of the regulations will need to be adhered to.

Year End accounts approved by the full Parish Council and now are going to be internally audited on 18 May 18. There are changes to the external audit. Parish Council completed the Annual Governance and Accountability Return 2017/18. Notice of Public rights and publication of unaudited annual governance and accountability return will be published on 1 Jun 18.

Please note that potholes can be reported directly to County Council via their online reporting system https://highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/.

Parish Council is further considering the Neighbourhood Plan and would welcome any new members. If you wish to get involved, please contact your Clerk.

Parish Council receives CIL money which will be used to refurbish the Village Halls. Village Halls are now in the process of getting the guotes and will approach PC for further PC consideration. PC are also considering other projects.

2 vacancies have arisen in the Office of the Parish Councillor

Please contact your Clerk for further details.

Mowing

Continue mowing, and increase the frequency. Try cutting one way then cut at 90 degrees to it to give that criss-crossed fairway look. The grass will look and grow better if cut little and often, rather than one big cut. This month cut no lower than 3/4 inch (2 cm).

Top Tip - Stems: You may need to rake stems upright that creep through the lawn so they stand up and the mower can cut them.

Organic Fertiliser/Seaweed Treatment

Apply either a liquid or granular feed to bring out the best in your lawn at this time of year. We use an organic feed as granule or in a seaweed form. It really does work wonders.

Patio/Driveway Weed Control

Weeds can look unsightly at this time of year in patios and driveways. We can spray a total weed killer to kill them and keep weed free for up to 6 months.

Disease Alert- Red Thread

It may necessary to spray a fungicide to cure the problem. If you do notice areas of "red thread" please call us and we will advise accordingly.

Actions required in June

- Mow lawn lightly; don't cut shorter than ¾ inches (2 cm) this month. Grass will respond better if cut little and often
- Treat weeds with herbicide once actively growing
- · Feed lawn with an Organic fertiliser
- · Treat weeds on driveways, paths and patios
- Red Thread Disease Control may be needed

Sawtry Chorale



Mr Pernickety visits a new Restaurant in the Stukeleys (Twice); Hoorah!! (Ssh, I cannot say where!)

Mr Pernickety was quietly invited to a pop-up restaurant along with a number of other critics and our other halves last month. The location I was told was a secret and was to be revealed only late on the day before we ate. Obviously, it was not to be the only current eatery in the village (!) Intrigued I agreed to attend and on the day having been finally given the address found I could walk to the venue and WOW what a lucky man I was! What I found was what can only be described as a 'gastronomes version of heaven'. The menu was to be five courses with the dishes being classically Greek, and I do mean classically; not the run of the mill Anglo/Greek tosh that gets served up normally but pukka historically correct manna from heaven.

Our chef met us as we arrived at the door with a waiter handing us a capacious glass of Ouzo & Orange juice. It was a sublime start to a superb evening. The sixteen of us ate at one long table with the critics coming from a radius of 60 miles or so, several of whom `vlogged` and `blogged` on line. Indeed, one gave a running commentary on the meal as it was served to her attendees on the net! The Chef (a lady!) is very well known for her excellent food and indeed she sells out every night she cooks. On this occasion she was bringing her skills to this locale as a trial and thank God I was invited. I only hope she holds another `critics` night soon!

And what a meal; the anticipation was so, so, worth the wait!!



The selection of `Mezze` to start consisted of:

Chicken Souvlaki,
Spanakopita,
Deep fried Courgettes,
Baba Ganoush,
Tzatziki,
Saganaki & Lemon,
Roasted stuffed artichokes,
Calamari Salad,
Fasolia Gigantes,
plus, Leaves, etc.

It is fair to say the portions were just enormous.

And that was for starters!

This was followed by a classical Moussaka made by following an 1800's menu and was topped with a turmeric & nutmeg infused egg béchamel. It was sublime in its depth of flavour and was not at all greasy in texture. A rich full red wine accompanied the dish.

The third course was a classical Greek Beef Stifado with shallots and tomatoes being braised with Greek herbs and spices. The flavours were just amazing. This was served with lovely warm Orzo pasta with Charred Roasted Peppers and Feta. The bowls of Stifado were so big you could have dived off a spring board into them!





With a belly now straining at my belt we then moved on to the most delightful selection of Greek Sweet things such as Fig, Cashew and Dark Chocolate Baklava; sweet Boureki with cheese and pine nut honey (my favourite); Portokalopita, an orange filo with honey syrup and Kandopita, a walnut cake with honey. These were served with a sweet Canadian Ice wine which matched alarmingly well.

To finish we were treated to Semolina Halva with almonds and raisins served with a lovely Greek Brandy.

Total time spent at the table was a languid and wonderful four hour.

Superb, just superb.

The foregoing review was submitted to the editor in March but in a fit of pique he did not print it as he felt he had been left out!! Soooooo......quess what?

Yes, the restaurant has opened up again, in fact it was the weekend of the 28th/29th of April. So, if you continue reading you will see the review of my latest visit

On being alerted that the Little Stukeleys Pop Up restaurant had opened for business once again, we manged, almost by sleight of hand, to get a couple of bookings for what turned out to be a wet and windy night weather wise but a very warm and welcoming, gut busting night, in terms of food. When we arrived, it was to find a mixed selection of diners; a number being from the village as word had got around and some from a distance away. This time we were to be treated to a classical Spanish menu and I have to say once again the food was sublime. I will not wax heavily on the matter I will just let the following tell the story;

The starter was a Gazpacho Caliente Soup but unusually it was warm and by God it was just marvellous. The addition of a superb oil to float on top was just a master stroke.



This was followed by TEN Tapas dishes of all types;

Morcilla de Burgos y Pan Frito with roasted red Pimiento (Fried Black Pudding with roasted red Pimiento),

Chorizo and Butter Beans en Tomate, (Chorizo and Butter beans in Tomato sauce),

Tortilla con patata y cebolla, (Tortilla with Potato and Onion), Albondingas (Meat Balls), Manchego and Jamon Croquetas (Cheese & Ham Croquettes), Gambas con Ajo y Pimento (Prawns with Garlic & Pepper),

Pollo y Chorizo Pinchitos (Chicken & Chorizo Pinchitos), Atun con Alcachofas y Aceitunas (Tuna with artichokes and olives), Chorizo de Bellota with Olives (Chorizo Acorns) Queso Manchego (a classic Spanish Cheese)

All served with Artisan Sourdough and paired with Tempranillo, Rioja and Rueda red wines



Then to the main course with belly's popping; a superb `Paella Valenciana` in the full on Spanish tradition of the area! As you can see it was just a feast for the eyes as well as the nose and mouth. The prawns were succulent and so flavoursome, the rice infused with all the ingredients of the dish and just the correct consistency of being not too wet and yet wet enough to have soaked up the bang on tastiness of the dish, the chicken soft and yielding.



Paired with the white Albariño, and of course, the White Rioja wine made every mouthful feel as though heaven had opened its gastronomic gates!



The sweets that followed were varied:

Torrejas de Canela (Cinnamon sticks), Miguelitos with Chocolate (Pastry squares filled with chocolate), Tarta de Santiago (Tarte of St James – Almond)

Just enough for a mouthful or two of each selection.

Mr Pernickety cannot wait for the next opening of this restaurant. With continued interest it could well turn into a regular event.






