

Before the evening's business proceeded the Chairman invited members of the Parish Council and members of the general public to stand for 1 minute's silence in memory of John Derek Middleton who recently passed away.

He was a long serving member of the Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee.

Parish Council successfully filled in 2 Vacancies for a Parish Councillor.

#### The Stukeleys' Parish Council welcomed Glyn Evans and Aston Cull.

#### There is still 1 Parish Councillor Vacancy

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor please contact the Clerk or your local Councillor for further details.

In May we had 2 meetings – one for the public to raise any matters of concern called Annual Parish Meeting/ Assembly and the other one called Annual Parish Council Meeting when the Chairman and Vice-Chairman were elected. The Stukeleys Parish Council signed the Year End Accounts which will be internally and externally audited. Please check the Parish Council website for further details and notices.

The Stukeleys' Parish Council met on 13 May 19 and discussed these planning applications:

1) Residential development (2 dwellings) Site Address: Land East Of Manor House Owl End Great Stukeley Reference: 19/00841/PIP - No comments.

2) Submission of reserved matters (appearance, access, landscaping, layout and scale) in respect of the construction of a new roundabout from the A141 including drainage, landscaping and associated works. Site Address: Land West Of The East Coast Mainline Railway And North Of Spittals Way Huntingdon Reference: 18/01577/REM - No comments.

3) New signage and lighting Site Address: Stukeley Country Hotel Church Road Great Stukeley Reference: 19/00600/LBC – received 11 Apr 19 - No comments.

4) 18/01217/FUL The erection of a building to accommodate the Headquarters and Air Ambulance Station for Magpas, including hangar and garaging space for a helicopter and emergency vehicles, with associated landscaping, car parking, and boundary treatment, with access from Ermine Street

PC Recommend Refusal: It was agreed to recommend refusal because of overlooking, loss of privacy and noise to existing properties. Potential loss of business to the neighbouring properties.

5) Conditional Information for 1201158OUT: Condition 9: Amended Key Phase 1. Condition 10: Amended Key Phase Framework a) Design Code b) Indicative Sequencing Plan c) Archaeological Investigation d) School Site Plan e) Key Phase Transport Assessment f) Key Phase Travel Plan & Mitigation Strategy g) Delivery Plan h) Site Wide Strategy Supplements (Water, Ecology & Code of Construction Practice) and i) Sustainability Statement. Site Address: Alconbury Airfield Ermine Street Little Stukeley Reference: 19/80094/COND – Note: Extension provided by HDC till after PC May's meeting. Draft Response put together and circulated to full PC for the approval

PC issued a separate detailed response which consisted of PC concerns other issues raised.

Erection of two-storey Cambridgeshire County Council Civic Hub (4,219sq.m GEA), comprising office space with an ancillary multi-function meeting area (to include Full Council Member Meetings), support space, a staff break-out area, with provision of vehicular and cycle parking, and associated landscaping to site. Location:
Cambridgeshire County Council Civic Hub, Ermine Street, Alconbury Weald, PE28 4WX Application No.: H/5005/19/CC

The Stukeleys' Parish Council welcomes the County Council to Alconbury Weald and is supportive of the county's decision to relocate as a recognition of the growing significance of Alconbury Weald.

Stukeley Parish Council does however raise concerns in respect to the ambitious travel plan assumptions within the submission and the level of parking to be provided within the site. In particular concern is expressed in the early years of the new building in advance of the enhanced sustainable transport infrastructure being implemented- it is a concern that particularly at this time on site parking will not be adequate leading to overspill parking into the industrial area.

It is requested that consideration is given to provision of additional parking.

7) Ermine Street Plan HU1 By Savills 13 Mar 19 – At the last meeting in Apr the points were raised by SPC and the response received to the key issues. Since the meeting Savills provided the following points of clarification:

- Gross density: 17dph
- Net density: 40dph
- Illustrative depth of planted buffer on the western boundary: 15m
- Distance between existing properties and the site boundary are indicated on the attached

The application will be submitted in outline and so the detailed design will be secured as part of a future Reserved Matters application with the associated consultation also held at that stage. Reserved Matters include layout and landscaping.

Savills also informed PC that the suggestion that the provision of two tennis courts on site would be appropriate and this would be combined with a financial contribution for off-site enhancements to outdoor sport in the local area. This would be secured through a S.106 Agreement attached to any planning permission.

The Parish Council agreed that the approach cannot be determined until the routing of the A141 is resolved. PC suggested Savills attend the next PC meeting in Jun where PC can share their thoughts and concerns on the development.

It was noted that email from Alconbury RAF re: ROAD CALMING MEASURES - B1090 ERMINE STREET NORTH of LITTLE STUKELEY - ROUNDABOUT FOR A14 received.

It was stated that at a meeting at RAF Alconbury on 25 Jan 19 various road calming measures for consideration in conjunction with the work that will take place at the LVIS entrance to RAF Alconbury were discussed. One of the measures was the reduction of the speed limit on the B1090 road north off Little Stukeley up to the A14 roundabout which passes the LVIS gate entrance to RAF Alconbury and the main access road to the housing development and primary school on Alconbury Weald. As an application for a reduction in the speed limit for road safety reasons has to be initiated through The Stukeleys' Parish Council. PC were asked to raise a case at the next Parish Council Meeting for the consideration of a reduction in the speed limit for any further road traffic accidents (RTAs), as they already had 2 minor RTAs at the LVIS gate road junction.

PC were notified that to ease the traffic flow the base were working with Cambs CC Highways to have a no entry box placed on the road by the LVIS entrance which will help traffic exiting and entering the base at peak times.

PC felt it would be useful to have another meeting.

Neighbourhood Plan (NP) - Update on the Neighbourhood Plan with recommendations for next steps prepared by Councillor A Hallihan.

It was agreed that Highways Sub Committee should be formed under the chairmanship of Ashton, date of first meeting to be agreed.

### **Comments on road improvements**

Reflecting on our past is always fascinating. Cambridgeshire County Council undertook junction improvement works in 1991 to improve safety at Green End to reduce the risks at this accident hotspot. Whilst well intended, it does seem bizarre that nearly 30 years later, the recent highway improvements through the Stukeleys appear to have introduced new hazards into our local community. Hazards include: inadequate vision splays; poor junction definition; lack of signage; confusing priorities; poor road surfaces; and proximity to higher speed zones.

Whilst the majority of drivers do navigate the new road layouts with care and caution, a minority don't, which has led to incidents and near misses. We look forward to the proposed County Council safety audit and hope they address our concerns, which we know are shared by many fellow villagers. Let's hope they can be addressed quickly.

We wonder what our community will be saying in 2049?

#### The New Road Layout – A near miss!


I'm writing about an experience I had today.



**Online Access:** We encourage patients aged 16+ to register for online appointment booking and ordering of prescriptions. You can also request online access to your medical records by filling in the appropriate form and providing our reception team with photo ID. An application for the latter will involve a GP review of your notes to ensure that they are suitable for release so please allow 4 weeks for this to be approved and ensure we have your email address on file to enable us to send you your access information electronically.

**Extended access:** The GP federation in Huntingdon currently offers our patients GP, Nurse & Health Care assistant appointments at evenings and weekends at the Acorn Surgery in Huntingdon and at Buckden Surgery. If you wish to have a routine appointment out of hours, then please do ask our receptionist who can book you into this service. With effect from July 2019 we will be offering our own GP and Nurse/HCA appointments on a Saturday morning at Alconbury Surgery. **Team Changes**; We welcome a new Nurse, Lorraine Quantrell to complement our existing team in May. In April GP Trainee Drs Salahi & Nelaptla left us and we were joined by Dr Wedian Eltom, Dr Emma Goldesgeyme and Dr Funmilayo Dada. Dr Luke Thompson will be increasing his sessions with us from July this year and Dr Emma Hattle is returning to locum for us over the summer period.
