

Rebecca Britton, Urban & Civic re: Application on Parcel 4 was read. Rebecca Britton will be coming to 6 March 17 Parish Council Meeting to provide a briefing note on Parcel 4 Planning Consultation.

Planning consultation on Parcel 4 is now received and Parish Council comments need to be submitted to Huntingdonshire District Council by 17 March 17

16/02013/REM - Amendments to Redrow Homes application for development at Alconbury Weald, <u>http://publicaccess.huntingdonshire.gov.uk/online-applications/</u> - received from Case officer 18 Jan 17, due back to HDC 7 February 17.

Recommend Approval: Application is in line with the overall Alconbury Weald development plan. Road trenching was also discussed at the meeting, R Britton, Urban & Civic, will be working with contractors to restore verges to the previous state.

There is also going to be a meeting with Hunts Ramblers, Urban & Civic and Parish Councillors re: proposed diversion and upgrade of footpath 11, - site meeting is set week commencing 27 February 17.

Outstanding matters: 16/02493/FUL Change of use from vacant land (previously A3 restaurant) to open self-storage facility (B8) - PC recommended approval but requested that 'Subject to planning conditions being imposed so the developer and the successors must maintain the external appearance of the site and containers may not be stacked higher than 2'.

Community Listener volunteers needed

This is Lizzie, she is one of our local Healthwatch Cambridgeshire volunteers and is helping us with a new project to look at how health and care services communicate with people who have a sensory loss.

Lizzie's told us "I am a service user myself and have disabilities so I rely on good healthcare and support, such as having a good relationship with the GP."

Our volunteers are people like you who live or work in Cambridgeshire. You know the place you live and the people in your community. We need your help to talk to more people about Healthwatch and find out what care is like for them. You will listen to people within your local community who have used health or social care services. This may be your family, neighbours and friends, or people you meet within your local networks.

You may visit local groups, chat with people and record what they have to say.

You might talk to people about Healthwatch Cambridgeshire. This may involve giving a short presentation, or working with us on a display stand.

We will give you training and support, as well as paying agreed out of pocket expenses.

As a Community Listener, you could also train to take part in our 'Enter and View" visits to local health or care services. This is our legal right to visit places that provide publicly funded health or care services, to see and hear how people experience care. In the last year, we have visited Addenbrooke's and Hinchingbrooke Hospitals.

THIS COUNTRY CALLED ENGLAND: INCLUDES: Thames Cruise from Windsor to Runnymede *Thursday 18th May 2017*

The *Ankerwycke* Yew is an ancient yew tree close to the ruins of St. Mary's Priory, the site of a Benedictine Nunnery built in the 12th Century, near Wraysbury in Berkshire. This is a male tree with a girth of 8 meters (26 feet). This beautiful tree is at least 1,400 - and could be - 2,500 years old.

On the opposite bank of the River Thames are the meadows of Runnymede and this very tree is said to have been witness to the signing of the *Magna Carta* by King John in 1215. This tree is surrounded by myth and legend and it is widely believed that beneath its boughs, King Henry VIII began his first liaisons with his future ill-fated wife, Anne Boleyn, in the 1530's. The *Ankerwycke Yew* is a hidden gem of *Magna Carta* folklore and you can visit this tree with a short walk across the fields on the flat on my THIS COUNTRY CALLED ENGLAND day trip.

Mr Pernickety Re-Visits (But only for a very short duration): <u>The Stukeleys Inn, Great Stukeley Village, Huntingdon</u>

You may recall that in the November edition of the village magazine I wrote a review of the above pub which contained the following points "...with one interior wall having peeling plaster work... The beers on offer were uninspiring being various kegs of dubious reputation plus Green King IPA and a guest ale. Neither of the cask ales was in tip top condition upon serving with the wines on offer best being left in the bottle!...". This resulted in my being excluded from the establishment by the then landlady as detailed in a subsequent comment in the February edition of the magazine. In between the two publication dates, bearing in mind the copy has to be with the editor some two weeks prior to it being printed and delivered, the landlady spoken of in the review (and the chef) left under a local constabulary inspired cloud and thus I ventured into the pub for the wake of a dear friend of mine. I was received with politeness and indeed ventured into the pub on several occasions over the next ten days. It was noted on my visits that the peeling plaster work on the wall had been dealt with and the cask ales on offer were of a much higher quality than previously so some note had been taken of my comments.

Sadly I now have to report that I was contacted on the 20th of February and told I am yet again unwelcome in the pub until I apologise to the management in this magazine for the comments made in the November edition. The explanation being the owner had not seen the commentaries previously.

Thus I will not be returning to The Stukeleys Inn for the foreseeable future as I see nothing to apologise for. The article was truthful and was my own opinion and indeed the management have taken some of it to heart hence the repaired wall and the increased quality of ale. The disappearance of the landlady and chef I had nothing to do with.

As British people we have an unfortunate trait which is not shared with many of our continental neighbours; that of keeping quiet when asked the eternal phrase "How was the meal/event/visit sir?" whilst muttering under our breath that it was awful. We should instead speak our minds and in that way hope that improvements are made or indeed plaudits are taken to heart. Thus the reasoning behind publishing the reviews I have undertaken of establishments I have visited over the past five years.

Still it is a first, being banned for giving a truthful and honest opinion.

Mr Pernickety Visits: <u>The Admiral Wells, Holme Village, Cambs</u> <u>The lowest pub in Britain</u>

The pub is a short distance from the A1 and sits right next to Holme Fen Reserve. Who was `The Admiral Wells`? The Wells family came to live in Holme circa 1760. They had three sons the eldest of which was Thomas. Joining the Navy in 1774, Thomas worked his way through the ranks to become a Vice Admiral of the fleet in 1808. His grandson, William Wells, sunk a massive iron post into the ground (taken from Crystal Palace) in 1852 to celebrate the draining of Holme Fen. At the time the top of the post was at ground level, but now just over 150 years later the top of the post is more than 13 feet above ground due to erosion and continued draining of the land. The surrounding land is the lowest point in Britain. The present pub was built in 1856/7 and is very typical of its time.

My clients and I visited the pub mid-week and found it was busy with around thirty or more customers. Not all were eating which is not a bad thing in itself as it soon became very evident that the owners, for it's a `free house`, encouraged customers to stay for a drink only as well as those who had arrived with lunch in mind which is what had brought us to its doors.

The bar had five real ales to choose from, all I was pleased to see from local small brewers. They were kept in perfect condition and easily quaffable, especially the Diggfield ale. There were also the usual run of lagers plus I noted a selection of sugar free drinks to cater for the diabetics amongst the clientele.

We ate the liver and bacon, the steak & ale pie and the poached loin of cod all of which were large in portion and very tasty. The mains were not cheap at £8/£10 a plate but the quality was evident. We were kept warm by a large open fire which in itself assisted in the atmosphere of a happy welcoming pub.

Beware the pub keeps what would now be termed as `old fashioned` opening hours, although I see nothing wrong in this, so lunch is Noon to 14-30hrs.

In short It's a proper pub and you needn't feel like you have to eat there, if you want just a drink you will be made just as welcome. What all pubs should be.




