There was no meeting in January. The Stukeleys Parish Council met on Mon 4 Feb 2019. February meeting was well attended by the public, representatives from David Lock Associates, Urban & Civic representative Rebecca Britton, Breheny Civil Engineering representatives as well as County and District Councillors.

Presentation was carried by David Lock Associates on the pre-application consultation process and latest iteration of the Cambridgeshire County Council Civic Hub proposals at Alconbury Weald.

A group of Parish Councillors re-formed a working group for the Neighbourhood Plan. Further steps were approved by the full Parish Council at the February's meeting.

Parish Council carried some trees and hedges works in the parishes.

At the December's Parish Council meeting Councillor Karl Gasson resigned from the Stukeleys Parish Council. Although Councillor K Gasson offered to continue working on maintaining and updating The Stukeleys Parish Council website after his resignation. The Stukeleys Parish Council thanked Councillor Karl Gasson for all the continuous support and work done for the community of The Stukeleys and noted that he will be missed.

The next Stukeleys Parish Council meeting is scheduled for Monday 4 Mar 2019 at Great Stukeley Village Hall.

Practice Update: Our list size continues to grow as we welcome new patients from the various developments occurring within our Practice area. We now have over 10000 patients with approximately 55% of these registered with Brampton and 45% with Alconbury as their primary surgery. We would like to reassure you that we are working hard to grow our team to ensure we have adequate capacity to maintain the current level of service and meet future patient need.

Dispensary Update: As many of you will be aware we are now only permitted to dispense to approximately 50% of the patients registered with us at Alconbury Surgery. Anyone living within a mile of a licensed chemist became a non-dispensing patient in June last year and must now obtain their medication from any Pharmacy of their choice. We would like to take this opportunity to thank our patients for the overwhelming support they have shown the Practice and our Dispensary team during what has at times been a difficult transition period.

Team Changes; We welcome a new Medical Secretary, Diane Bliss, to complement our existing team. In December Dr Salahi joined us, in February Drs Singh and Taiye-Akinsun will leave as they become fully qualified but we have Dr Eltom joining the GP trainee Team. In April Dr Shilpa Nelapatla leaves us for her next training placement but Dr Emma Goldesgeyme and Dr Funmilayo Dada will be joining us for four months. The first 6 months of 2019 is also a busy time with us hosting medical students from Cambridge University.

Albram continues to work hard for the Practice by raising funds and providing an essential car service to improve access to services for local patients. We would like to thank the drivers and coordinators of this service as well as our long-serving committee members who volunteer their precious time to enable collaborative working between the patients and the Surgery.

Unacceptable!

Around lunchtime on Saturday 26 January, the second of a string of two riders and horses walking along Ermine Street in Great Stukeley toward Huntingdon stopped and allowed their horse to defecate on the footpath. When I walked the same route with my dog the next day, there was a large pile of horse excrement in the middle of the footpath. Tasty snack for the dog, not much fun for anyone else.

If you were that rider, you should be ashamed of your thoughtless behaviour, or worse, some sense of entitlement that allowed you to simply ignore the impact on others of that selfish behaviour.

Did you give any thought to people who use mobility scooters? If you had, you might have been concerned that having no choice but to ride through the pile of poo left by your horse, they then either must thoroughly clean their scooter or have horse manure spread throughout their house when they get home.

Did you think about bike riders? Again, with the overgrowing hedge on that part of Ermine Street, they had no choice but to ride through the middle of the pile of ordure you left behind.

Perhaps you consider it too difficult to stop and pick up after your horse? Did you think about stopping, securing your horse safely and walking back with a small shovel to throw the poo into the hedge? That's what I did after walking home to get a shovel. Why didn't you? A small folding shovel is available on Amazon from £5.70 with a nice canvas bag to keep it in and free delivery.

Perhaps the problem is that if you dismount, you can't remount from ground level? In which case, can you consider yourself safely in charge of the animal? A lorry driver who couldn't mount and dismount their vehicle as necessary would not be considered safe to control the vehicle. Why do you think it's safe to be riding an animal that's too large for you?

As a dog owner, I must carry multiple poo bags with me and clean up after my dog. Increasingly, local authorities are enforcing the rules and (quite rightly) fining dog owners who leave behind what their dog deposits and, in some cases, for not having a poo bag with them, regardless of whether the dog has defecated. Perhaps it's time the same standards are imposed on horse riders?






