

### Stukeleys Parish Council Meeting held on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> February at 7.15pm at Great Stukeley Village Hall:

Present – Cllr T Pinner (chairman), Cllr T Close (vice chairman), Cllr S Burton, Cllr B Parkyn, Cllr P Digby, Cllr G Evans, Tim Slater (3D planning – Town Planning Consultancy) and one member of the public.

Cllr Paula Tuck and Cllr Sally Smith sent their apologies.

It was approved for Emily Pacey to be appointed Clerk and Responsible Financial Person to Stukeley Parish Council. (Cllr T Close proposed and Cllr P Digby seconded, and all were in favour)

Cllr S Burton advised the traffic calming through the village is still a working progress and is currently still with Urban & Civic and Huntingdon District Council, one Electronic Speed sign has been installed on the approach to Lt Stukeley, three more to be in place within the month.

The application of the Stukeley's pocket park project has been confirmed and validated by HDC and the consultation is now open. Anyone who is in support of this application may contact Huntingdon District Council quoting reference 21/02824/FUL. The SPC urge members of the public to take this opportunity to help move this forward as speedily as possible.

**Key Phase Submission - KP2 - The Country Park (Hybrid Element) | Alconbury Weald Ermine Street Little Stukeley** The SPC reiterates its holding objection (initially made on the 3.12.19) and believes that this application remains premature until the alignment of the A141 is finally fixed and the country park can be properly designed in conjunction with any housing that may be ultimately acceptable on Grange Farm.

Cllr S Burton advised a first draft of the Neighbourhood Plan will be available by the end of February and will be available to the public.

Cllr T Close advised all payments are up to date and have been authorised on the bank account. It has been agreed and approved to have a separate bank account for all CIL transactions. (Cllr S Burton proposed and Cllr B Parkyn seconded, and all were in favour.)

Regarding flooding issues at the allotments Cllr T Pinner advised he had a meeting with Urban & Civic. They propose to dig a trench so any overflow of water from the allotments will go onto the surrounding fields. He advised Urban and Civic will cover the cost for this.

Cllr P Digby advised he is attending a virtual meeting with HDC to discuss the LHI application for 2022/2023 on the 2<sup>nd of</sup> March. He did advise he will approach Urban & Civic as they still own all the roads on Alconbury Weald, and it will be up to them to change the speed limit to 20mph.

It was agreed that SPC will make an application to HDC for two dog poo bins one to be cited near the allotments at Gt Stukeley the other on Low Road Lt Stukeley.

**The Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebration.** This has been referred to the next PC meeting, any members of the public or organisations within the parish that may have outline plans for the celebrations are welcome to make those known to the SPC.

The next PC meeting will be held on the 7<sup>th of</sup> March at Little Stukeley Village Hall.

#### A response to Bill Crean's and Bob Hulstrom's articles on climate change from the December and January issues of the magazine.

Firstly, like Bob, I am not a scientist. I rely on my information on climate change from those that are experts in their fields and I have to concede that Bill is far more qualified than I am to make a judgement on the validity of the arguments made to support or undermine the subject.

However, in every profession there is always a range of opinion on almost every subject, and I have no reason to think that this is an exception. I take Bill's point that some parts of the media over-sensationalise items to grab the attention of their audiences. Social media can be problematic as, due to the way their algorithms are written, we all end up getting fed stories which broadly line up with our own, pre-existing views based on those stories we click on to read. This results in an ever more concentrated echo chamber of likeminded opinions and does nothing to broaden the knowledge of the reader. This has always happened to an extent as we tend to buy those newspapers, listen to those radio shows, and watch those news channels that make us feel comfortable, but the likes of Facebook and Twitter have accelerated this to an unprecedented degree. Time was when you might hear some outrageous nonsense from the local eccentric in the pub about how the government had planted a radio in his fillings to control his behaviour and you went home and forgot all about him. Now he, and countless thousands more, are on the internet blasting their drivel out to the world. And some people are listening to them.

Back to my point. Given all of the above, after reading Bill's article I thought I would do some research of my own and decided that rather than going through Sky News or the BBC (both fine institutions whose news channels I watch regularly) I would look at the climate page on NASA's website

(<u>https://climate.nasa.gov/evidence/</u>). I chose them because I doubt they have any particular axe to grind and because I was almost 9 years old when Apollo 11 landed on the moon and NASA has been an organisation I've admired ever since.

What I read wasn't comforting and I encourage you to go and read it for yourselves but a few points stood out:

The surface temperature of our planet has risen by 1.18 degrees Celsius since the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, most of which happened in the last 40 years.

The Polar Icesheets in Greenland and the Antarctic have lost an average of 279 billion and 148 billion tons of ice per year respectively between 1993 and 2019.

Glaciers are retreating around the world and Spring snow cover in the Northern Hemisphere has decreased over the last fifty years and the snow is also melting earlier each year.

Global sea levels have risen by 20cm (approximately 8 inches) in the last century but in the last twenty years this rate has increased every year.

As I said at the start, I am not a scientist, but I am a grandfather. To be perfectly honest global warming won't affect my life too much and likely not the lives of anyone I care about who is alive today. However, as a grandfather, I would like to think that my grandchildren's children, and their grandchildren, will have a chance to live in a world similar or even better than the one Bob, Bill, and I have enjoyed all our lives. If that means paying a bit more to help the growth of the renewable energy sector, cutting down on unnecessary travel and trying to do what I can to reduce my carbon footprint, then I will do it gladly. That way they can grow up to live in Alconbury Weald and not Alconbury on Sea.




