



Reflections on my Cable Car Capital Trip: Tuesday 12th March 2013

The week before my Cable Car Capital Trip we experienced rain, cold and very foggy weather. So, I was just delighted when Tuesday 12th March 2013 arrived with cold but very clear and sunny weather.

Due to very low levels of traffic during our journey and the clear weather we arrived an hour ahead of schedule in London. We were able to make an unscheduled stop with a most welcome morning coffee break at Canary Wharf.

Our well informed *Blue Badge Holder Guide*, Jeanie Carmichael, met up with my group at Canary Wharf .Jeanie took us to the *Tereza Joanne*, a boat moored in the Royal Docks, for a terrific breakfast Brunch which had been organized just for my 52 strong group. From the large windows of the *Tereza Joanne* we had a splendid view of London City Airport, which juts out into the Royal Docks, and the planes landing and taking off.

However, due to the high winds Jeanie warned us that the Cable Cars had stopped flying for safety reasons. We missed our 2pm flight and our flight scheduled for 6pm was not guaranteed.

After Brunch we rejoined our coach for a wonderful sight seeing tour of the capital. Jeanie gave us a great informed commentary on places, buildings, people and events as we passed the Shard, the London Eye, Big Ben, Trafalgar Square, the Mall, Buckingham Palace, Hyde Park, the Bomber Command Memorial, St. James's Palace and Clubland. We went on through the City of London and the East End, past the Olympic stadium to our next stop at the biggest shopping mall in Europe, Westfield, where we had time for a coffee and a comfort stop.

On rejoining our coach at 5.45pm we received splendid news. The cable cars had just started to fly and we would now be able to take both flights! The Cable Car Centre was only 10 minutes away at Canary Wharf and we went straight over to catch our flights.

It was as clear as a bell in the Cable Car and we took many pictures and, on the return trip from the 02 Arena, dusk fell and we were treated to a splendid view of the lights of the capital.

Clarence House and Famous Mothers' Trip Tuesday 6th August 2013

Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother's principle home for the second half of her life was CLARENCE HOUSE. Despite her initial dismay at having to move there after the death of the King, she gradually grew to accept it as an effective London base. With the help of friends and advisers she decorated her new home well and imbued it with a sense of continuity.

Standing off Stable Yard next to St. James's Palace, Clarence House was built by John Nash in 1825-8 for the Duke of Clarence, later King William IV. Through the nineteenth century the house was lived in by a succession of junior members of the Royal Family. After the Duke of Connaught died in 1942 the house served for the rest of the war as the headquarters of the British Red Cross Society and St. John Ambulance Brigade. It was damaged by bombing and had to be extensively restored before becoming the married home of Princess Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh in 1949.

At our last meeting on 20th March, 14 of us looked back to where we originated from and what brought us to the Stukeleys. Of the 14, 5 were born within the Parish, 2 in other parts of Huntingdonshire whilst the remaining migrants, like me, came from various other parts of the United Kingdom – Lancashire, Hertfordshire, London, Essex, Bristol, Oxfordshire and Nottingham. There were some interesting stories. Margaret Helme gave a fascinating account of her farming based movements around the country, whilst for others a recurrent theme was the upheaval of WW2 and being evacuated to a safer rural environment. Later, the stationing of RAF personnel also figured as a factor in people locating here.

She explained that the Carbon Footprint is an attempt to measure how much carbon pollution we are causing. The UK is the fourth highest in the world with a footprint of 10 with Quator, USA, Australia all having a higher footprint. She also pointed out that the population is now rising 1 billion every 12 years and there are now 7 billion people in the world.

She also touched on climate change, extreme weather conditions, nuclear power and nuclear waste, wind farms, gas power and solar power. She certainly made us all think about our carbon footprint. She then showed us some quilts which she had made depicting various Eco systems. Doris Saddler thanked the speaker for her very interesting talk

There is an open day at Headquarters in London on 16th October. The resolution this year is: The Decline of Town Centres.

We discussed various summer outings, but no decision has been made yet. Jenny Thilo is collecting information for the Christmas party and will report next month.

The 2013 Huntingdon 10k charity run; With added fun run and spectator village

For the last 3 years, the Stukeleys have played host to the Huntingdon 10k charity run, which has directly raised £14,000 for the race charities, and a staggering £50,000 overall, including the runners' own sponsorship. Many of you in local villages have been involved in helping out and supporting the run, and the organisers (new fundraising group, Hullabaloo) would like to thank everyone for their help- and anticipate your help and support again this year!

The route for this year starts and finishes on the Alconbury airfield, and the event will include up to 1000 runners for the 10k run as well as a 3k fun run and a spectator village, with activities such as bouncy castle, face painting and traditional games. This year we have a dog agility display, featuring dogs trained by Michelle of Fetch-It dog training, and a healthy eating cooking demonstration and free tasting from Cook Italian! Charities and local groups can spread the word about their cause from a stall, and everyone from non runners to enthusiasts can have a great time!

Update from Alconbury Weald

The last few weeks have seen some real changes around the former airfield, as it starts its transformation into Alconbury Enterprise Campus.

The opening of the new access - a short distance north of North Gate on Ermine Street (B1043/the old A1) - and new gatehouse will be used temporarily as the main entrance to the former airfield while the historic North Gate entrance is refurbished. From Winter 2013 it will become an access specifically for construction and Heavy Commercial Vehicles accessing the site, with the refurbished North Gate being opened up for cars, bikes and pedestrians.

With the new access open, work has been able to start on the Campus' first new building – the Incubator. This will provide flexible space at the heart of the development for small and start-up businesses – with a particular emphasis on high-tech manufacturing and research & development. Wisbech-based Kier Construction has been awarded the £2.5m contract to construct the flagship environmentally friendly building and as part of the contract will employ an apprentice and provide work placements for local construction students.

The development has also started work on its new community tree nursery, which is being created with the support of 11 unemployed young people. The team carried out the work as part of a Green Skills course to create the nursery while gaining qualifications and work experience. The six-week programme was funded by Urban&Civic, and delivered by Groundworks working with Hunts Regional College and Jobcentre Plus. It also involved local firms SJS Property Services and JJM Services who took part in interview panels with the group to provide experience and feedback to the group. Further schemes are planned over the coming months as part of Urban&Civic's commitment to supporting skills development and opportunities for local people and local businesses.

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
