

1, Apologies for absence

2. Minutes of 2015 AGM

Amended to show Grahame and Dawn Bundy under Apologies.

3. Matters arising

Deanna Strange raised concerns were raised about the condition of the car park and that urgent repair is required. The Committee is in discussion with Urban & Civic and their contractor Breheny regarding how they could support improvements. The Committee has received some donations towards these and is preparing an application to WREN for specific items of work that can be grant-aided.

Jim Butter asked if the car park could be used on an ad-hoc basis by villagers. This would be considered by the Committee on an individual basis on request.

The use of the barriers was also questioned. They are not operational but could be repaired.

Grahame Bundy asked about progress on the maintenance jobs list and noted that they had not been done. Some could be could be done 'in-house.' The Committee agreed to review and prioritise the list, target fundraising where required and request support for a working party.

The Table Tennis Club have asked about the possibility of blinds to reduce glare on top windows at front.

4. Treasurer's Report

A copy of the draft accounts was made available. There are some queries to be raised confirmed with the auditors.

Donations were received from Great Stukeley Flower Show towards the new cooker totalling £1,738.80.

Donations were also received from Mary Allyene-James totalling £876.11 to be used towards car park improvements.

Other fundraising totalled £863.78. Total income for the year £18,226.57 Total expenditure for the year £14,725.88 Total profit £3,500.69 Total reserves TBC 12k plus 5k.

It was noted that a proportion of these funds would be needed towards any projects funded by the WREN grant.

Janet Sly asked why, if our financial year runs March to February, that the accounts are not ready for AGM. It was confirmed that the draft had been received earlier today but there were some items to be confirmed.

Deanna Strange asked if cheques be banked more regularly as one of here had taken some time to clear. The Committee confirmed that with Helen Silsby taking on the role of Treasurer this would be addressed.

It was asked if the accounts could be published on line.

5. Trustees' Report

Sarah Toyn summarised the year. The Village Hall has a healthy bank balance due to increased hall usage and fund raising events. Regular hall users are the Table Tennis Club, WI, Monday Night and Friday Morning Bridge Clubs, Craft Club, Heritage Club, Pilates, Slimming World, Badminton and the Church of Jesus Christ and the Latter Day Saints

We received a donation of £656 from funds raised at the Swinging 60s Event organised by Mary Alleyne-James. This is to be used specifically to repair the car park. The WREN application to cover the cost of insulating the stage area and kitchen and fitting a disabled access ramp, amongst other things is being put in hand. Nicola Oldfield has been in touch with Urban & Civic about using their contractor Breheny to repair the car park and put in disabled access and there is a possibility that they may contribute to the cost of these works.

Our main fund raising events were:

Open Gardens and the St Bartholomew's Flower Festival on 5th July. This was a great success, because as well as local residents, visitors attended from far and wide having seen our listing it on the Open Gardens website. Many visitors commented that they enjoyed the wide variety of gardens. The next one will be in 2017.

This year's Christmas event was a relaxed social on 18th December with guests enjoying mulled wine, mince pies and a chat with their friends. We had good feedback from this and may consider holding similar events at different times of the year.

Bond Casino night on 20th February which went down a storm. This was enjoyed by all who attended, so much so that we are putting on a Las Vegas Casino night on 3rd December as the village hall Christmas event.

There is a small, dedicated team of people behind the scenes who are essential to the efficient running of the village hall. Sarah thanked Janet and Barry Nunley for their continued hard work in maintaining and repairing the hall, assisted from time to time by various friends in the village, and also Hilma Young for her work in taking bookings and invoicing. Sarah also thanked the Committee for all their hard work and dedication throughout the year before, during and after the events to ensure that they ran smoothly

6. Appointed members of the Committee

It was proposed that: Nicola Oldfield represents the Heritage Group; Iain Shaw represents the Flower Show Committee; Sarah Toyn represents the WI; Sarah Toyn represents the Table Tennis Club.

No nominations were received for representation from the Parish Council or from the Monday Bridge Club.


Need to find local health services quickly? New 'MyHealth' app for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough

Team Changes; At the beginning of April GP Trainee Dr Anyanwu left us but we have been joined by Dr Rizkallah and Dr Toonah. Dr Kooverjee remains with us until May, Dr Hattle until July and Dr Jiwa will be at the Practice until August 2017. We also have Cambridge University Medical Students with us in October, November and December for 2017. All trainees are supported by our existing GP team to ensure you continue to receive a positive experience at the Surgery.

Albram continues to work hard for the Practice raising monies and we would like to take this opportunity to thank them for recently purchasing 2 new hydraulic couches for the Practice which will make it easier for patients with limited mobility to be examined in comfort when they consult with their GP. The Albram AGM is planned for 11th July this year and we do hope to see some patients in attendance. It is an opportunity to gain an insight into how we work collaboratively with ALBRAM to support local access to extended primary care services and enhance the patient experience at the Surgery.


