





## **Parish Council Meeting Report**

All Councillors, the County & District Councillors, together with representatives from the District Council, Urban & Civic and the Highways Agency together with three members of the public attended the October meeting of the Council held in Little Stukeley village hall.

The Highways Agency described how the new upgrade to the A14 would take shape and emphasized on several occasions that the decision to 'Toll' the new stretch from Swavesey to Ellington was one made by central government. They pointed out the financial benefits to the area of the upgrade and the fact that the tolls would be kept at a lower level, cars £1 and lorries £2 in the prime objective of keeping the right traffic on the right roads. The Parish Council decided to make a written response to the consultation and whilst they were completely in favour of the upgrade they had major concerns that the application of tolls would, by virtue of 'rat running' on local roads, seriously reduce the impact of any financial benefits that could have been expected, a full text of the Councils response can be seen at the clerks home on application.

It was reported that a bollard system would be introduced in Owl End at its junction with BW 10 to prevent motorized access to the bridle way, footpath 13 hopefully will be refurbished with monies from the County Council, Urban & Civic and the Parish once clearance for the works is agreed with the County.

All allotment plots are now taken and the more serious work of obtaining grant aid for the central building construction will be taken on by Mr. & Mrs. Vincent and Mrs. Smith.

It was reported that there were serious flaws in the rabbit fencing works in the playing field, so payment of the account for the work was to be delayed until a site meeting had been held with the contractor to establish a possible way to remedy the problems. The offer by the American Authorities to get young service personnel to undertake some voluntary maintenance work twice a year through the villages was to be further investigated.

The next Council meeting is on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> November 2013 at Great Stukeley village hall commencing at 7.30pm.

CORONATIONS and CELEBRATIONS tells the life story of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, from humble beginnings in London's Mayfair to her Marriage and Coronation at Westminster Abbey.

The following itinerary will brief you on this superb trip which everyone is very much looking forward to...

- 08.00am Please plan your arrival at the great Stukeley Village Hall. PLEASE NOTE that there is no parking at the Village Hall.
- 08.15am PROMPT departure by C&C Coaches from Great Stukeley. PLEASE BE ON TIME as we have a 71 mile journey ahead at rush hour.
- 10.15am We pick-up our specially requested Blue Badge Holder Guide, Jeanie Carmichael, outside the Doggets Coat and Badge Pub, on Blackfriars Bridge. Jeanie will be with us for the rest of our time in London
- 10.30am We arrive at The Mad Hatter Hotel and Pub, situated on Stamford Street for morning coffee and biscuits. The cost of our 45 minute visit is included in the price of your ticket.



## **Cambridgeshire County Council needs you to help change the lives of local children and young people.**

Foster Carers provide a stable family support network for local children and young people when they are unable to live with their own family. Every year we have over 425 children and young people looked after by Cambridgeshire County Council.

The shortage of Foster Carers means that children and young people are placed with (independent foster carers or residential units some outside of Cambridgeshire) they may also be looked after within the county children's homes. A total of £11,350 was shared between six charities by the Cook Italian Hunts 10k by Race Director Bob Hulstrom at a presentation evening held at the MS Therapy Centre in Huntingdon - [www.hpcmstc.co.uk](http://www.hpcmstc.co.uk).

All six charities support people across the county, helping to make a difference to their lives.

Bob said: "This year, we have handed more money to good causes than ever before as the race has steadily grown in popularity since it was launched four years ago.

"Everyone who entered the 10k race or the 3k Fun Run contributed towards this amazing fund raising total. We are also grateful for the generosity of all our sponsors, including Urban and Civic which hosts our race at Alconbury Weald and our media partners at the St Neots News and Crier."

Riding for the Disabled received £3,400 which will sponsor the care and stabling of one of the ponies at Northbrook Equestrian in Offord Cluny where children and young people with mental and physical disabilities have the chance to learn to ride.

Embrace Child Victims of Crime were given £2,000 to help support young people in the county who have been affected by crime in some way. By working in partnership with Cambridgeshire Constabulary, the charity will identify the most vulnerable young people to help.

Alconbury Thursday Club will be able to provide entertainment for the elderly and socially isolated people they support, some of whom are also affected by conditions such as dementia. A new hearing loop at the centre will also be fitted using some of the £1,500 they have received.

St Ives Day Care Centre is run by volunteers to provide day care and a hot meal for elderly people who need additional support and social interaction. Their £1,500 will replace the dishwasher and also provide training to volunteers to



ensure people with dementia or Alzheimers are given the support they need. MENCAP received £1,200 which will be spent at the Heron Club, St Ives. The club supports adults with learning difficulties who will now be able to enjoy karaoke and a new range of games the money will buy.

The MS Therapy Centre in Huntingdon will treat carers to pamper sessions using the £1,000 they received.

Huntingdon Sea Cadets received £500 and Great Stukeley Village Hall £250 for the help and support they provided on race day.

Bob added: "Plans for 2014 Hunts 10k are already shaping up. 




