THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Stukeleys Parish Council meeting was on Mon 2 October 17 at 7.15pm at LSVH.

Parish Council had a presentation made by Rebecca Britton, Urban & Civic regarding Alconbury Weald development.

Parish Council discussed this Planning Consultation:

Tree Preservation – To be amended by HDC as the wrong site address submitted: 17/01900/TREE T1 large Ash at the rear boundary of the church. House behind is heavily shaded by the dense crown of the tree – propose a 20% thin to the crown and a 3metre crown raise from the ground level to let light pass through, Land at 67 Ermine Street, GS.

As the wrong site address was provided, PC agreed to ask HDC to correct the mistake and then re-circulate the application so that PC could properly comment.

Finance committee is going to meet and discuss the policy documents as well as put forward the Budget proposal for 2018/19 to the next Parish Council Meeting in Nov.

Please note that Neighbourhood Plan group is still looking for volunteers to join! Please contact Councillor D Robinson on david.robinson@thestukeleys-pc.gov.uk for further details.

As advised by the Internal auditor, Parish Council took photos of Parish Council Assets, and will now match them to the Assets list, so when Clerk or Councillors need to identify the asset they will precisely know where it is located.



A VISIT TO ALLERTON CASTLE

Tuesday 24th April 2018

We are gearing up for a wonderful trip to visit the beautiful *Allerton Castle* on Tuesday 24th April 2018.

Allerton Castle's gothic grandeur has been painstakingly rebuilt after decades of decay and a devastating fire. This **GRADE 1** listed Castle, near Knaresborough, in North Yorkshire has a very rich history dating back centuries. The Castle, worth an estimated £11.5 million, has been given as a gift to the nation for the public to enjoy.

Dr. Gerard Arthur Rolph bought the Castle in the 1980's. Donating it to the people of England Dr. Rolph said that this was done to preserve the Castle. "Being here with a glass wall around it just isn't right. It has to be enjoyed by people".
