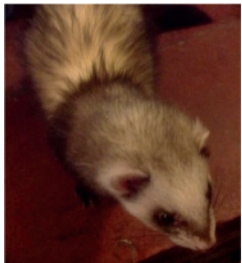

September Parish Council Meeting Report

Eight councillors, District & County Councillors, Rebecca Britton, seven team members from the Abbey Group Solar Panel Development Group and three members of the public attended the September meeting of the Council in Great Stukeley village hall. The main thesis of the open session was a presentation by the Abbey Group of their proposals to build a Solar Panel farm on 53 hectares between the East Coast railway line and the new Alconbury Weald development, this land having been established to lay within the Parish boundaries of the Stukeleys and not Abbots Ripton as was intimated by the Local Planning Authority. It was explained that the site had the capacity to provide power for some six thousand houses for twenty five years, it was assured that no development traffic would pass through the villages. Many ecological benefits were forecast especially for endangered insects and small mammals, the layout would provide a safe, insecticide free environment, for these species, specific grass and wildflower planting would facilitate some grazing for sheep. Many questions followed from both public and the Council, these were answered, in our chairman's words, in a full and frank manner.

In a subsequent debate and vote in the full council meeting it was agreed by six votes to one to approve the application, as there was no defined planning reason to refuse, there was no adverse impact on neighbouring property, and importantly this type of power production was needed, there were many ecological benefits and interestingly the design and build would allow return to agricultural purposes with minimal impact. Peter Brown informed that it was more than likely that the area would be effected by some industrial action by the Fire Brigades Union this autumn.

There was no news as yet on the Cambs ACRE housing needs study that they had recently conducted in the Parishes.

Ms. Britton reported to members that she was still investigating solutions to various footpath/Bridleway issues in the Parish with her contractors and the County Council, the Council agreed to her request for a letter from the Council in support of the proposed 'barrier' introduction at the junction of Owl End & Bridleway 10.

Mr. Vincent reported that there were just two plots still available, one full & one half size. **Is there anyone within the Parish that still needs a plot?** Please Contact Mr. Vincent, otherwise these plots will be offered to a wider public. He reported a problem with self-set rapeseed, it was agreed that all plot holders should receive a letter from the Council reminding them of their responsibilities and Ms. Britton agreed to speak with a contractor to deal with the problem on land outside the allotment area.

Mr. Vincent also reported a delay in the fencing work in the playing field, it was agreed that the contractor be given the ultimatum of a start by 16th September, it is since noticed that the work has commenced. Following unauthorized use of the field and problems with dogs it was agreed that the clerk order new signage to display the rules for use and the fact that DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE RECREATION FIELD, the only exception being guide dogs.

The next Council meeting is on Monday 7th October 2013 at **7.00pm** at the village hall, Low Road, Little Stukeley.

and
FAMOUS MOTHER'S trip: Tuesday 6th August 2013**

We were blessed with beautifully warm and sunny summer weather on the day of my CLARENCE HOUSE trip. August is the only month of the year this beautiful Royal home is open to the public. We departed from the Great Stukeley Village Hall on time at 08.30am and made excellent time to London until we hit solid traffic and road works in the City which slowed us down.

We met our well informed *Blue Badge Holder Guide*, Jeanie Carmichael, on Queen Victoria Street in the City-a few yards from the delightful Salvation Army Café. We joined the coach at 11.15am for what turned out to be a very informative journey around central London with Jeanie pointing out statues and buildings of interest in connection with Motherhood from Roman Times through the present day.

Shaakira Taara Hill - My testimony



My name is Shaakira Taara Hill. A Muslim name giving to me by my parents. It is derived from the Arabic vernacular. Shaakira meaning "thankful" and Taara meaning "big bright eyes or star". As a child I was raised Muslim. I had no legible idea what being Muslim meant or how to be a Muslim. My parents never taught it to me and were not very consistent but, we are all humans we make mistakes. I love them regardless just as God loves me. I did not have very much as child of seven children. With a childlike optimism, I did not think I was poor or had any lack. As far as I was concerned I had everything I needed: Food, shelter, and family. As my testimony goes on the realities of the world set in, in a way that the devil had me right where he wanted me.

My father moved us from our small home in Los Angeles, California to the city of Atlanta, Georgia. At the time I had no realization on why we were moving. I was a small child and very much happy with what I had. My mother told me it was to keep my father and brothers from trouble. Like a child I took that for face value. My parents could do no harm to me, which is still true to this very day. Coming into my adolescence and growing up I never had consistency in my family. Also, with that inconsistency, some very dark things were taking place in my family. Everything was kept behind closed doors and in the dark. Just like darkness there is light. Everything comes to the light. I am going to shed some light on my past. My brothers, Sister, and I sin against God together. We laid down as a husband and wife should. We played house thinking it was all innocence. We do not know what we are doing, so that makes it okay. We made the excuses that we were young and foolish trying to cover up what really happened. What really happened is we sinned against God. Not only were we naive to what we had done. We were also ignorant to fact and felt like sense we were young we did not have to repent.

As time went on my Muslim faith was almost nonexistent. We did some practices of the Muslim faith every now and again. What we lacked in faith we tried to replace with material possessions. My father went school and found a job at Motorola. It was a blessing that my father could provide for us now but it's funny how the devil knows how to twist things up in such a fashion to make you think you found God in a worldly way. Even so much so that you being to praise the material things and forget about God all together. My family and I were so wrapped up on the material possessions and things we never had, we did not even think practice a faith (Muslim) we choose to believe. We were so entangled to keep up with the Jones, My mother got a job to. Leaving us to watch after one another. It was like the blind leading the blind. The Devil had my family right where he wanted us.

Things went south fast. My dad and mom were arguing. My eldest brother Gregory, my mom's first son from her previous marriage got into some trouble. He was incarcerated. My brother Gregory was my mother's pride and joy. She took up for him even against my father. My mother

made that known or the devil tries to twist it that way so that my father, brothers, sister and I could feel some animosity towards her. I held something against her for that kind of care. My parents ended up splitting up. That divided our house into Christian faith and Muslim faith. My dad left the house, so it fell upon my mom to guide our faith. It was a failed attempt because she was lost herself. The fighting amongst us became more violent. In the process my mom, sister and little brother were diagnosed with bipolar schizophrenia and drug habits. The devil was attacking me and he was holding no punches.

I was so lost! How could the very foundation on which you base your whole life on be so adrift? My family was a mess. I questioned God. If you love me why would you let me go through this? How come it's taking you so long to find me and rescue me? I tried to look for love in all the wrong places. Everywhere! The Church, my friends, and my flesh. Indeed I Gave a man a part of me that God said, "save for your husband." I was giving my body to any man I thought loved me. I would get so wrapped up in a man I literally thought I could not live without him. I worshiped him like he were my God. I hung on to his every word. So, much so I changed myself to suit his standards. Instead of us walking with the Lord together in faith. I let him choose who and what I should worship. I was on a path to nowhere. The devil had me right where he wanted me. Not even realizing, I was my own problem. I tried to lean on my own understanding of things and failed every time.

Finally, as I reached a cross road in my life. I had plenty of opportunities to give myself over to the Lord. The devil cloaked my eyes to my real condition. I was fearful of what was happening to me on Earth. I let that fear shadow me from my true blessing. My blessing is finding the Lord Jesus Christ. I let the Holy Spirit in. Through the Holy Spirit, I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for my sins and my slate is whipped clean. I was born into a newness of life in the body of Christ. THANK YOU JESUS!

This is my true Testimony, please share this with everyone so they may know the Joy I found in Jesus Christ! MY LORD AND SAVIOR!

What follows is a letter that Shaakira sent to her Father

Dear Daddy.

I am an adult. I made this choice on my own. I walked to church. I bought the Bible and I read it. With no help from man. I understood it on my own. I asked Pastor Pete to baptize me on my own freewill. I felt something in my life change the day I myself... Your daughter, your flesh and blood accepted that Jesus Christ died on the cross for my sins so that I could be made whole in him. I am sorry if you feel my choice is wrong daddy. I hope you will still love me regardless. This has nothing to do with what has been said to me! It was God in me that I repented and accepted Jesus Christ into my life. I will obey the teachings of the Father who art in Heaven. Hallowed be Thy name. I hope you forgive me. This is a Choice I made with The Father, The Son and The Holy Ghost.

I love you.

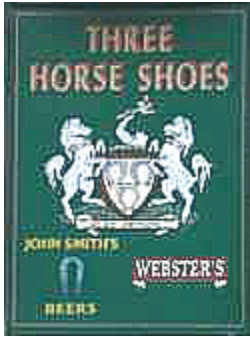

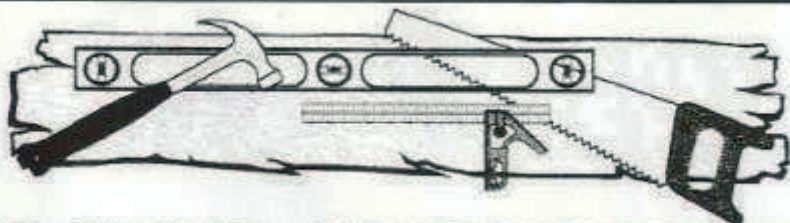
