

THE STUKELEYS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council meets 1st Monday of the month, and usually does not meet in August, but this year due to planning applications to be considered there was an extraordinary PC meeting in August. Also, the Parish Council met in September and the next planned PC meeting is on 3 October 2016. Please come along and have your say at the open meeting which starts 7.15pm on the night. The Parish Council also held an extraordinary PC meeting on Mon 19 Sep 2016 to co-opt 2 new Councillors and address other business.

Applications discussed at 15 Aug 16 Extraordinary PC meeting:

i Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street – 16/01445/REM – Submission of reserved matters (access, appearance,

landscaping, layout and scale) in respect of the construction of a primary electrical substation, new landscaping, highways works and ancillary works.

Following recommendation from the Planning Committee it was **RESOLVED** to support the application as it was part of the overall infrastructure improvements for Alconbury Weald.

ii Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street – 16/01329/REM –

Application for approval of appearance, access, landscaping, layout and scale in respect of the construction of 165 dwelling, pocket park, associated highways, landscaping and ancillary works.

Following recommendation from the Planning Committee it was **RESOLVED** to support the application and the quality of the design and detailing. There were no other concerns.

iii Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street – 16/01101/HZC –

Hazardous Substance Consent: Proposed storage of up to 49 tonnes of ISO Pentane (P5a Flammable Liquid – Category 1). The Parish Council's Planning Consultant advised that the license application was being made following the grant of REM for the erection of the IKO building earlier in the year. The application was not strictly a planning matter and was made to HDC for consent to store a hazardous substance within the site. The location was remote from new residential areas and was to be in a location where the manufacturing of IKO had been previously approved- presumably the B2 elements of this were known at the time – not sure hazardous substances were mentioned.

For the limited information in the submission it was understood the ISO Pentane was a highly flammable liquid used in the manufacture of foam packaging. It was proposed to be stored in a bespoke designed location.

Suggested comments for the Parish Council to submit were;

provided that the hazardous substance was stored in properly designed and managed environment then no objections to be raised. The recommendation for the Planning Committee and the Parish Councils Planning Consultant comments were considered and discussed. The recommendation for the Planning Committee was not supported and after discussion it was **RESOLVED** to recommend refusal as the Parish Council was concerned about the storage, processing and handling of hazardous substances on Alconbury Weald and lack of information that had been provided to the Parish.

iv Alconbury Weald, Ermine Street – 16/01546/FUL –
Construction of a 13,287 sqm. Building comprising B1(A),
B1(B), B1(C) and B8 uses, highways works, car parking,
landscaping, lighting, minor ground remodelling and associated works.

Following recommendation from the Planning Committee it was **RESOLVED** to support the application and the quality of the design and purpose. There were no other concerns.

i Land East of Steve's Private Hire, Ermine Street – Town & Country Planning(General Permitted Development)(Amendment) Order 2001 – Proposed telecommunications installation upgrade and associated works.

Recommend Approval

SPC is pleased to see 4G mobile upgrades extend out to the Stukeleys. **RESOLVED to recommend Approval.**

ii Champagne and Seafood Bar, Huntingdon Racecourse, Thrapston Road, Brampton – 16/01583/FUL – Extension of Seafood Bar to form Owners & Trainers Lounge Recommend Approval

SPC recognises that businesses need to develop and grow. **RESOLVED to recommend Approval.**

iii Land South of 10 & 12 West View, Great Stukeley – 16/01597/FUL – Erection of two dwellings.

Recommend Refusal

Vehicular Access is insufficient due to poor road construction, width and road joining with Church Road; particularly to accommodate an additional 4 vehicles.

Great Stukeley Park & Football Pitch By Louise Blencowe

I often go up to the Great Stukeley park for a break and whilst it is relatively peaceful and a nice enough place to just relax and spend some time alone and not just with the added privilege of a children's play area I feel that the park is rather a bit bland, you have two benches under damson trees and you've also got this pagoda type shelter but the rest is basically just all pitch area. I know that a lot of the space there is used for sports and for just general recreation but I feel the rest of the field could do with something more scenic, to look a little bit nicer, maybe something like a flower bed or a pond or some other environmental accessory such as beautiful fountain although that might be a bit over the top if you're considering the cost! I also feel that there are not enough benches either, there are many parts of the field that are unused and could be put to something useful or environmentally friendly. I had an idea for a wildlife reserve area as we seem to have a variety of different species, not just talking birds but butterflies, insects, rabbits, pheasants even moles!

I also think that it would be good to have a smoker's bin or a box instead of stubbing it out on top of that one bin near the pagoda seats or on the benches of the ground. I know a lot of people go there and have a smoke and sometimes you can see cigarette ends all around, not very pleasant but then again I think that if people want to smoke they should dispose of it safely in a special cigarette bin or box whichever is best, but just stubbing the thing out on top of a rubbish bin is disgusting as you can never be too certain the fag is out or still smouldering, and making the bin all dirty. And I have also even witnessed people throwing them in the bin after finishing (Hello Fire Hazard!) Addenbrooke's Abroad – The Good Samaritan

In the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37) we are told to 'love our neighbour as yourself' as we learnt about the meaning of helping someone who is a stranger.

As our thoughts turn to Harvest Festival celebrations and we are reminded of all the good things God has given us and how fortunate we are. The parable of the Good Samaritan springs to mind of how fortunate we are and how simple acts can have a huge impact on strangers less fortunate.

Addenbrooke's Abroad, based at Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge is a volunteer programme in which clinical staff volunteer their own time to provide specialist training and support to long term healthcare projects around the world.

One of these projects is providing lifesaving training and education in El Salvador to help reduce maternal and neonatal mortality rates.

Currently in El Salvador maternal and neonatal mortality is FIVE times higher than here in the UK.

Everyday mothers and babies in El Salvador die as a result of complications during and following childbirth. Most of these complications are either preventable or treatable and all these mothers need is access to specialist doctors and healthcare workers. It is this lack of specialist training which is one of the key reasons why so many women and their babies die or babies are left without a mother.

Such specialist care is often out of reach from the world's poorest women. Globally around 2.7 million new born babies die every year. In many rural areas of El Salvador there are only 4 doctors for every 100,000 residents.

Dr Sue Broster, Consultant Lead for the Acute Neonatal Transfer Service (ANTS), Addenbrooke's Hospital and Addenbrooke's Abroad volunteer explains the situation

"The medical staff are left to learn literally by trial and error, it is a tragic fact that nurses have been known to leave babies that they know are not breathing because they feel powerless to intervene due to a lack of specialist training. Imagine how it feels to go home at the end of your shift knowing that babies have died because you have not been able to give the appropriate care."

Addenbrooke's Abroad is helping to change this frightening statistic by recruiting a multidisciplinary team of volunteers who work with the local hospitals to deliver an annual congress in El Salvador. The annual congress provides specialised practical training in how to manage and treat obstetric and neonatal emergencies to healthcare staff from across El Salvador.


