

THE STUKELETS PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Stukeleys Parish Council met on Mon 4 September 17 at 7.15pm at GSVH.

Parish Council discussed the Planning Consultations listed below and submitted planning recommendations to Huntingdonshire District Council:

Proposal: Extension of Seafood Bar to form Owners and Trainers Restaurant, Site Address: Huntingdon Racecourse Thrapston Road Brampton, Reference: 17/01640/FUL. Recommend Approval: Acceptable use.

Proposal: Construction of new dwelling house with parking and amenity, Site Address: Land To The South East Of 6 Ermine Street Great Stukeley, Reference: 17/01672/FUL. Recommend Approval: No reason for refusal. Acceptable use of the land.

Proposal: Erection of 4no. two-storey detached dwellings with ancillary garaging, parking, landscaping and access provisions. Site Address: Land North Of 13 Moorfield Way Great Stukeley, Reference: 17/01497/FUL. Recommend Refusal: Overdevelopment of the site due to the lay out density of the buildings.

Parish Council also submitted comments re: Huntingdonshire Local Plan to 2036: Consultation Draft 2017 - http://consult.huntingdonshire.gov.uk/portal/pp/hlp2036/cd2017/cd2017.

Parish Council is in the process of implementing the recommendations made by the Internal Auditor for the Year Ended 31 Mar 17.

External audit is now completed and the External Auditor's Report and Notice of Conclusion of Audit are published on Parish Council's website and Notice Boards.

Please be aware of 'Cold Callers' which were noticed in both villages.

Please note that Neighbourhood Plan group needs more support from the residents.

Parish Council is in the process of getting 2 more quotes re: Compost bin to be installed by the Allotment Gardens at Great Stukeley (The compost bin is going to be used for the grass cuttings (from both villages) to be disposed of).

Mr Pernickety Visits: <u>The Bank` Free House, High Street, Willingham</u> (Just off the A14)

Formerly a village bank (Lloyds) until 2010, this micro pub opened in late 2012 after many months of careful restoration of the building. The building itself dates from 1831.

The pub consists of a single room with a short bar, which was rescued from a closed Cambridge pub, thus it qualifies as a 'Micro Pub'. The walls are decorated with photos of local interest. The landlord, Chris, is a very chatty lad and gives a wide smiled welcome to all from what we could see. He is happy to engage in conversation no matter what the subject, again an old-fashioned landlord

And so to the beers. Lordy, lordy what a choice. SIX real ales directly poured from the barrel, all small breweries and a wide variety of styles. If that's not enough there are two modern craft ales. Of all the ales tasted my favourites where 'Harpoon', an American style bitter and 'Sonoma', a fruity tasting bitter. For the lager drinker, there is one tap but again it's not a fizzy mass-produced lager but one crafted with care; at the time of our visit it was 'Adnams'. For the cider drinker there are several choices, all again from the barrel and again none of the modern mass-produced water masquerading as cider.

And guess what? NO television, NO pool table, NO piped music, NO Juke Box, NO food, NO one under the age of 25 let in; oh, ok that's a 'porky' but when visited no one under that age was visible and the pub was rammed with both sexes. And that was good to see as well, a true fifty, fifty split between the ladies and gents, all chatting away around the three tables and along the bar. Amazing is it not that a pub like this can be as full as it is every night its open and yet the big brewers will have you think that these pubs are no longer wanted, I think not! And this in a village with two other pubs of the normal sort. As a pub, I am sure it's much busier than it ever was as a bank!

Yes, it's a proper pub, a pub as it should be, a pub as they used to be minus the fag smoke. Sadly, it's not in my village, sob, sob, but then again, I imagine my wife is very pleased it's not, although she would at least know where to find me!

REFLECTIONS: ROYAL LONDON: KENSINGTON PALACE
Monday 4th September 2017

30 people were signed-up to make an incredible trip to London visiting *Kensington Palace* on Monday 4th September 2017.

We left Great Stukeley at 10.00am making good time to meet our *Blue Badge Holder Guide*, Marian Bacon, outside the *Victoria & Albert Museum*. A number of people took a stroll to Thurloe Place where there was a choice of restaurants while others opted for lunch at the *Victoria & Albert Museum*

At 13.20pm we rejoined the coach taking a short drive where Marian pointed out various points of interest in Kensington including *Kensington Gore*, the *Albert Memorial* and the statue of *William III*. We were then dropped off opposite the entrance to Hyde Park for a very short stroll to Kensington Palace.

As we approached the Palaces' Golden Gates it was just like August 1997 with masses of flowers, ribbons, banners and photographs left by well-wishers in memory of *Diana, Princess of Wales* who died tragically 20 years ago. There were also a number of TV and Radio crews outside as our visit coincided with the news that morning of the *Duchess of Cambridge's'* third pregnancy.

We were able to visit the exquisite *White* or *Sunken Garden* which had been prepared for the anniversary. The abundance of White flowers, chosen especially to honour *Diana*, were magnificent.

There was much to see in *Kensington Palace*. This huge building has no less than eleven royal residents. We were able to explore the *Queen's State Apartments*, the *King's State Apartments* and *Victoria Revealed* exhibit-which uncovered the Public and Private stories of the various young royal families that have lived in this palace.

Diana-Her Fashion Story was fantastic. We choose the right day for our visit and walked right into this incredible exhibit. On other days, the waiting time to see this wonderful display could be up to 40 minutes! We were able to see a collection of *Diana's* most memorable outfits, on display at her former home, which included the *Travolta* ink-blue velvet gown worn at the *White House* in 1985 which sealed her fashion reputation.

Prior to our 6.15pm departure for Great Stukeley, with a planned arrival time of 7.40pm, we were able to visit both their Café for refreshments and their souvenir shop.

Sincere thanks are extended to our wonderful *Blue Badge Holder Guide*, Marian Bacon, "who really knows her stuff" and our driver, Paul Syrett, who delivered us "safe and sound" to and from London.

On Tuesday 24th April 2018, we will be taking a wonderful journey over to Yorkshire to visit the incredible ALLERTON CASTLE.

ALLERTON CASTLE is England's grandest and MOST Gothic revival stately home. The Castle was built by Lord Mowbray, Segrave and Stourton, the Premier Baron of England, as a monumental statement of his position within the English aristocracy. NEW! MUST VISIT: THE PEOPLE'S POST Tuesday 15th May 2018

I am very lucky to be able to offer this unique opportunity to visit the LONDON POST OFFICE RAILWAY, also known as MAIL RAIL, on Tuesday 15th May 2018.

MAIL RAIL is a driverless underground railway in London built by the Post Office with assistance from the Underground Electric Railways Company of London in the 1920's to move mail between the London sorting offices.

Designed SOLEY for the movement of letters and parcels it operates 19 hours a day,286 days a year. MAIL RAIL is located 70 feet (21 meters) below the streets of London and is 23 miles (37 kilometers) long running between Paddington in the West and Whitechapel in the East, with stops, and takes just 26 minutes.

INCLUDED in the cover price is a circular three-mile trip on the MAIL RAIL railway which can also be viewed from the control room via onboard cameras.

This trip will also include an afternoon visit to THE POSTAL MUSEUM with our *Blue Badge Holder Guide*, whom we will meet at a City pub for morning refreshments (not included in the cover price) at 10.30am.


