The Stukeleys Parish Council met on 2 September 2019

Please note that there is a public session at 7.15pm

The Parish Council meeting was well attended by members of the public who raised various issues including overgrown hedges in both villages, weeds in curbs, damaged drain covers. All the issues since the meeting were reported to the relevant bodies. Residents can also report Highways issues via https://highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/

Parish Council also sought residents' help to identify the areas of concern and either report via the link above or contact the Clerk or Councillor Sally Smith.

A presentation by R Britton, Head of Communities and Partnerships at U&C and Tim Leathers, Development Director for U&C was focused on the Country Park and Grange Farm Applications.

These Planning Consultations were received from Huntingdonshire District Council and discussed by PC:

 Reserved matters approval of access, appearance, landscaping, layout and scale following 1201158OUT approval - up to 84 car parking spaces and 8 motorcycle spaces, and associated landscaping and engineering works. Site Address: Alconbury Weald Ermine Street Little Stukeley 19/01591/REM.

Parish Council agreed to recommend Approval to the above planning application.

 Erection of wooden shed/garage Site Address: 51 Park View Great Stukeley Huntingdon Reference: 19/01535/HHFUL.

Parish Council agreed to recommend Approval to the above planning consultation.

Chairman of Planning Committee Cllr S Smith agreed to co-ordinate the Planning Committee and set a meeting to discuss Points 3 and 4 below. If Parish Council do not feel they have enough time to take response to Oct PC meeting, PC will seek further extension. It is also possible to meet HDC planners if needed. Density info sent by U&C, will be circulated to PC.

3) Planning Application for 1,500 at Alconbury Weald (Grange Farm): Outline planning permission (all matters reserved) for a mixed-use development to include- means of access, residential development of up to 1,500 dwellings (C2 & C3), local centre including retail and community facilities (A1-A5 & D1), primary school, open space, play areas, recreation facilities, landscaping, associated demolition, ground works and infrastructure. Planning advisor will circulate the summary for PC to consider.

Great Stukeley and Little Stukeley Village Halls are being refurbished using CIL funds. Chairman of Great Stukeley VH attended the meeting tonight to answer the questions raised by the Parish Council re: the application and quotes submitted for further refurbishment works. Parish Council approved the quotes.

Flat roof issues are going to be sorted at Little Stukeley VH using CIL funds, CIIr S Smith will lead this project.

Also, Little Stukeley Play Area's tarmac is going to be replaced as the best quote is now chosen and approved. The works are confirmed.

Little Stukeley Playing Fields will be tidied up using the CIL funds as well.

Lorry parking issues at Top Farm have been considered over a few meetings now. Cllr A Cull will be dealing with the matter. Any further emails to be forwarded to Cllr A Cull.



ROYAL AIR FORCE MUSEUM, Hendon "Wonderful trip into the present, past & future" Tuesday 21st April 2020




