Monday 4th September 2017

Mr Pernickety:



Pub Round Up.

I have paid several revisits to the pubs mentioned over the preceding months and can report:

The Sandford House Huntingdon: This has lost its lustre with customers, not surprisingly as an additional Weatherspoon's pub has opened in St Ives. The drop off on trade is noted by the factor that six of the twelve real ale pumps are now showing the same three beers between them and at least one of the remaining pumps now have a changing cider being dispensed. This leaves just five pumps with changing beers. Still a good choice but not what it once was. The service is still very good and place is still kept very clean. It is now very much underused at lunchtime.

The Falcon Huntingdon: Mr Pernickety was banned from this pub as the owner did not like the review so I have not personally returned although I am told it has withstood the onslaught from the Sandford House opening very well. Although, then again, I am told the pub still is to be found lacking in several ways but I cannot vouch either way personally.

The Mermaid Ellington: I have returned twice since I wrote the last review. Once at lunch time and once in the evening. The lunchtime visit was a disappointment as the food was lacking from its previous quality but the visit in the evening restored my confidence. The beers on both visits were excellent and as for the Rhubarb Gin; just delightful!

The Stukeleys Inn, Great Stukeley: Again, I have not visited as Mr Pernickety is still banned although I am told the infamous wall has been repaired and the beers are "OK". I was also told the barman in my review had moved on. I also note the editor received a `stiff note` from the owner because of my review. Shame.

The Three Horseshoes, Great Stukeley: Sadly, the pub is still dilapidated although the ownership of the `Bridlington Pub Company`, who own the managing rights, has changed. Again, sadly that owner has decided on both occasions to make excuses to not engage with the regulars. These actions do not bode well nor does the indebtedness in the company accounts as I noted after looking at them via the Companies House website. I would not expect much to happen here in the near future as it just means the current managers, like those before them, have been lied to yet again in regard to intended improvements.

Mr Pernickety visits:

The White Horse Inn Swavesey Village Just off the A14

There were 3 pubs listed in the village in 1765 and by the mid 1800`s this number had risen to 16, but dropped to 8 by 1912, and to only 3 by 1960. Since then the only public house in the village centre has been the White Horse Inn, adjacent to the village post office and shop in the village's former market area. The White Horse occupies a fine old building. The public bar is a true classic with its polished tiled floor, beamed ceiling, wood-panelling and elevated fireplace. The large lounge bar with dining area is in what was once a separate property and the pool and function rooms behind the public bar are also later additions. It has up to three real ales on hand pump and two dispensed by gravity from behind the bar. So far, so good.

When my companion and I visited it was on a weekday mid-afternoon and not surprisingly the kitchen was closed. From what we could see the menu was expansive and was reasonably priced. From the notices around the pub it was obvious that this was the heart of the village with all manner of society meetings taking place over the month. It turned out that the pub had been the venue for The East Anglian Pinball Show when there had been 18 (!) pin ball machines installed for a week and a competition had been held. It turns out this is an annual event held in July.

My eye was drawn to a very old fashioned but fully working jukebox in the public bar. It was a shame it was over seen by the now very large obligatory TV in the same bar with two other TV screens in other rooms!!

It was also the curse of the pub TV which drew the barman`s attention and from which he has to be wrenched to gain any conversation or indeed service. When he did serve it was for us to sample the `Beach Comber`, `Motorhead Road Crew` and `Rutland Osprey` beers. All of which poured and drank well.

The bar had the usual bar snacks plus large plastic bags of REAL Pork Crackling. The quality was superb.

Would I return? **No.**

Mr Pernickety visits: The Green Man Free House, Leighton Bromswald

A pub has stood here since 1253. In medieval times, the pub was referred to as 'The Blind Pig' and still retained that name when on the 25th of January 1650 it was licensed as one of the very first Gin and Ale houses in England and it has been so for the past 500 years. By 1821 it was known as the 'Little Inn' when it was almost destroyed by a lightning strike although the outer walls survived and so it was rebuilt.

The pub is timber framed and rough cast rendered with brick casing. It has a panelled door with a cornice hood and three ground floor casement windows with three gabled dormer windows also with casements. It has one large twelve paned (!) hung sash window in the cross wing with segmental brick arches. These being the main reason the pub was listed as Grade 2 in 1987. It has several 'nooks' and 'crannies' to sit in plus a pool/darts room plus an alcove in which proudly sits a 'Hooded Skittle' table complete with pins and wooden cheeses. Delightful.

The Green Man pub sign was rather large with quite a rude figure of a peasant in green holding a hoe but sadly it was removed in 1941 as scrap for the war effort. This was located opposite the current entrance on an old iron framework. Does anyone reading this remember it I wonder?

When we visited for lunch the bar was well supplied with three real ales from small brewers, (one was sadly 'off', with another going 'off' as it was poured), and a particularly fine German lager, one of those you can actually taste, not a cold fizzy drink. All three of us sampled the lager. There were also the usual suspects from kegs plus a good selection of wines. Points were lost due to a cloudy beer being served and lack of choice.

We ordered Goat Curry with Cardamom Infused Rice, Lamb kebabs with Rice & Salad & handmade Chips (!) and Lamb which came with all the trimmings. The curry was to die for. It was delightful in its balance of flavour against heat. The meat was tender and fell off the bone with the gravy thick and full of spices. For me the rice was a tad too full of flavour but I have say it matched the curry well. The Kebabs were just perfect as was the fresh garden picked crunchy salad. The lamb was asked for to be pink and boy it was spot on. My companion especially lapped up the gravy and gave it a full ten out of ten. The portions were big but not over facing.

The bar & waiting staff were attentive but in no way intrusive as can be the case in other establishments. The atmosphere was very friendly with a mixed clientele.




