DO YOU REMEMBER THE MEGATRON?

For nearly two decades the Megatron - the flying saucer-shaped restaurant at Alconbury - was one of the most recognisable landmarks in the region. It was sadly demolished in 2008, but two Cambridgeshire filmmakers are looking to keep its memory alive in a documentary celebrating this unique piece of cultural history.

Tony Conn and Paul Satchell are looking for people willing to share their memories of the Megatron. Did you work there in its early days, or in its days as a McDonald's? Do you have fond memories of attending as a customer or of living alongside the distinctive building? Maybe you didn't like it at all. Every story is of interest. Some even tell of UFO sightings and ghostly hauntings at or near the site.

The filmmakers are especially interested to find people who knew the creator of the Megatron, Danny Blundell. They're also trying to find Deborah Abbot, the local schoolgirl who won a competition to officially re-open the venue as a McDonald's in 1993 (her surname has probably changed in the meantime). Perhaps you can help them to track down Adriana Fionda or Mike Clark, each of whom managed the site in the 1990s. All aspects of the history of the building are being sought.

Originally opening in 1990, Megatron was the idea of local businessman Danny Blundell and was planned to be the first of a new franchise. The project was extremely ambitious. Blundell went on fact-finding missions to Elstree Studios, consulted with special effects experts, and even planned to have holograms welcoming patrons. The finished restaurant had innovative touchscreen computers for people to make their orders, regular laser shows, and a cast of performers playing robots and aliens.

In 1993 the business was forced to close and the building became a McDonald's. This made it the only space-themed McDonald's on the planet, an honour now held by a restaurant in Roswell, New Mexico. It eventually closed for the last time and lay derelict until its demolition in 2008. Conservationists at Huntingdonshire District Council tried to have a preservation order placed on the building, but it was too late.

The film will celebrate the vision of Danny Blundell, the beautiful building designed by local architect Graham Campbell, and all of the performers and other staff who made the Megatron such an amazing experience. Several, such as Rob Clapperton and Roger Bunnage, are still performing to this day.

As well as looking for your stories the filmmakers are also looking for any photos, video or souvenirs anyone might have. This was obviously a time before smartphones, so photos and video of the venue are very rare. Your contributions could make all the difference.

I read the article related to the recent road works written by Barrie James.

I concur with his concerns and comments but make the following comments.

These comments are directed to the road signs in particular at the bottom end of Church Road and Ermine Street.

Coming out of the village at the bottom is via a blind corner and the the road markings are inadequate!

The current road signs are 'give way' signs and these are advisory signs therefore in the event of a road traffic collision (RTC) it would be a 'he said she said' and the breach of this sign is non endorsable.

If the signs were changed to a 'stop' sign it is a compulsory and any breach is endorsable. It would also be clear in the event of a RTC where the blame would sit.

The ramps are also too far back from the junction, so it allows vehicles to speed up!

In short, the original layout was unsafe and presented a safety hazard for road user and I cannot understand how this was approved by Highways!

The amended proposal is only marginally better but without further changes will continue to present a real risk to the villagers.

THE STUKELEYS ROAD SHAMBLES

It is over 5 years since we in the Stukeleys were consulted over plans for proposed Ermine Street enhancements designed to ameliorate the effects of having a new town planted on our doorstep, and it would now seem apposite to review what has happened since then and perhaps seek some opinions from villagers.

According to my dictionary, to 'enhance' something means, *inter alia*, to improve its value, quality or attractiveness. No doubt opinions will vary on whether or not that has been achieved. Certainly, in Great Stukeley I suggest the weed beds created when the road was narrowed and the loss of our usual magnificent spring display of daffodils have not improved its attractiveness.

We now have posh 'gateway' speed limit signs to tell everyone where they are and remind them to refer occasionally to their speedometer, but from what I have seen the latter information is frequently ignored - despite reminders. However, in Great Stukeley one might be excused for not referring to one's speedo too often as much of the time is, of necessity, spent observing and interpreting a plethora of signs (including those, quote: "to prevent turning down Church Road"?), attempting to see around blind corners at ridiculous junctions, and spotting and negotiating the next obstruction. In addition to the original proposals, we now have an extra hump, a display sign giving hump expectancy, and several new signs directing 'through traffic', although it is not entirely clear which way is 'through'. One driver entering the village at the southern end of Church Road clearly thought that because she was on the 'through' route (straight on) there was no need to slow down at the junction. So, is it possible that the signs are misleading? Only time and accidents will tell!

Regarding the revised junction at the southern end of Church Road in Great Stukeley, I note in the "Make News" (Winter edition) an admission that: "Accidents and near misses have been witnessed, reported and occurred on several occasions, thankfully with no serious injuries." Oh well, that's OK then! Tim Close commented that "Following completion of the initial changes, the SPC received several complaints regarding the remodelled junctions." The highlighted phrase - indicative of timing, is at best misleading. Had there been 'joined-up' planning discussions someone may have taken note of comments that I and others made during the consultation phase and perhaps re-examined their proposals then, rather than when it was too late to change.

Immediately following the public consultation in early 2016 I wrote at length to Rebecca Britton (letter dated 14 March 2016) criticising many of the proposals, and with regard to the junctions I wrote the following:

"Change of Road Junction Priorities. If I had been asked to design an accident black-spot I think this would feature high on my list of proposals." I had no reaction or response to my letter.

And so to the manufactured disincentives to driving unnecessarily through the villages. We have a physical gate obstruction at the entrance to Little Stukeley and in both villages there are speed cushions and table-top road humps, all of which vary in profile. I think the new one just down from the Great Stukeley Village Hall must have been laid on a Friday afternoon; if I had such a deformed top on one of my tables I would confine it to the scrap heap. Is it really to design specification? That said, it is the only one that is effective; cars definitely slow down temporarily before going over it. However, overall there would appear to have been little, if any, reduction in speed between the humps and bumps or in traffic flow through the villages.

Having spent tens, or more likely hundreds of thousands of pounds on enhancing village life, I suggest nothing much has changed, except maybe Ermine Street itself, the surface of which has effectively been destroyed in both villages.

Resurfacing is now long overdue, and it should not be the Stukeley's residents who pay for it.


Finally, on a slightly lighter note, I would like to propose an additional sign at the entrance to the villages in order to raise their profile:

"Welcome to The Stukeleys Twinned with Humps and Bumps"

This would not involve local dignitaries going on expensive overseas jamborees. They could simply carry out their duty by visiting each hump and bump on a regular basis and ponder how it was that someone in their right mind could have designed such an enhancement!

Huntingdon police cadets need you!

A search has begun to find young people with a desire to to help their community and learn valuable life skills.

They are wanted for a new Volunteer Police Cadets (VPC) unit in Huntingdon, which will be open to those aged 13 to 18 who want to join the world of policing. Cadet leaders are also needed for the unit, which will be based at the heart of the force, at police headquarters in Hinchingbrooke Park.

It is set to open in the autumn and sessions will run on one evening a week, covering different policing duties, skills and basic law, as well as physical activity and drill.

VPC is the nationally recognised police uniformed youth group in the UK. Its purpose is not to recruit police officers of the future, but to encourage a spirit of adventure and good citizenship amongst its members and promote a practical understanding of policing.

It will also give young people the opportunity to make new friends, participate in activities and events, support local communities by taking part in social action projects, develop new skills, and see first-hand what goes on behind the scenes within the force.

Cadet leaders are in charge of running the sessions and will provide role models to young adults while also looking after their welfare and encouraging development. Leaders will have the opportunity to develop their own skills through challenging social action projects, such as supporting those vulnerable to crime, and fundraising events. A policing background isn't a requirement and adults from all walks of life are welcomed

Those interested in becoming a cadet leader will be subjected to the highest national standards of vetting and enhanced DBS checks before being given training to support and develop their knowledge and skills.

The force is currently in need of leaders across all seven VPC units. These are Ely, Cambridge, St Neots, Cambourne, Wisbech, Peterborough and now Huntingdon. Chief Constable Nick Dean said: "This is a great opportunity to become part of the volunteer cadets here in Cambridgeshire. I have seen cadets really develop throughout their time with the scheme and it's a fantastic opportunity to become part of the wider policing family and involved in a range of activities and the community. Whatever your background you can make a real difference."
