Stukeleys Parish Council Meeting held on 4th July 2022 at 19.15pm at The Club 4 Meeting Room, Second Floor, Alconbury Weald

Present: Present: Cllr T Pinner (chairman), Cllr T Close (vice chairman), Cllr P Digby, Cllr G Evans, Shaun Burton, Paula Tuck. Emily Pacey – Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer was absent on maternity leave

Also, present CCCIIr Steve Corny, HDCCIIrs Steve McAdam and Ann Blackwell and one member of the public.

Ms. Kathy Harrow gave a brief presentation regarding a proposed community shop at the Stukeley Hotel and asked if the PC had any objections. Cllrs were fully supportive

Co-option of Mr Philip Pearce as a councillor for SPC. Cllr Burton questioned his eligibility to join SPC, the HDC website informs that applicant can stand so long as they live within 3 miles of the Parish Boundary. Mr Pearce, a resident of Stukeley Meadows, is currently a Huntingdon Town Councillor has completed code of conduct training.

CCCCIIr Corny reported on staff shortages leading to delays in matters including highways issues

HDCCIIr McAdam reported on the new administration, that it is led by a coalition and that there is a £2.4 million budget shortfall.

HDCCIIr Blackwell reported feedback from several parishioners regarding speed and density of traffic in the villages. CIIr Digby updated on the discussions with U&C regarding a 20mph speed limit on AW

Cllr Tim Close reported that occupations on Alconbury Weald are now circa 830. Country Park, that U&C are in talks with Nene Park Trust as a management partner for the Country Park.

A proposed pub on AW is on hold at present as no suitable working partner has come forward, and the proposed Co-op store is work in hand with a planned opening in late 2022 or early 2023

Cllr Shaun Burton reported that the Neighbourhood Plan consultation period has now ended, that U&C felt they should have been consulted over designated green spaces within AW, that HDC are largely in support of the plan but questioned the defined village boundary. When the final consultation document is completed and submitted to HDC for examination, following a 6 week period a referendum will be called, all expenses to be covered by HDC.

Cllr Peter Digby reported that he has been in discussion Ermine Street Church Academy and parents who have had difficulties in placing there children at the school despite it being there nearest option.

The Pocket Park project in Gt Stukeley has moved forward, a fee has been paid to HDC to apply for a Certificate of Lawfulness that will allow the project to go ahead as Permitted Development, if agreed by HDC, which seems likely as they suggested this course of action.


